I started tracking the decline of Gold Membership since 2014. We grew once in 2017 and that was only a 1% growth. Over the past six years our Gold Membership has dropped 36%

Our TJ Sokol checking account looks healthy but this will change in 2021. American Sokol did decrease their dues for 2020 and waived convention dues because of Covie-19. Likewise, Southern District waived their dues for 2020. Had they not discounted and waived dues, we would have kicked up an additional \$9,000 or more.

Treasurer Report By Ray Elleven

I reported on our Gloom and Dome in the August 2020 edition of the Sokol KHB Newsletter. Covid-19 has caused the Club Room to close three times in 2020 hurting our rentals. No Bar. No Rentals. The result is a devastating checking account. It cost us an estimated \$3,600 a month just to be closed!

By August we were shopping for the cheapest plywood to board up the building when we received an anonymous \$50,000 donation! Then a month later, we received an additional \$10.000 from the same donor! We were asked to match the donation and we are trying. We started Monday night dinners and several members have donated cash to the cause. I'm proud to say we've raised a little over \$15,000 towards that goal.

We were getting back on our feet in December when the last shut down occurred. We think this shutdown will continue until April or May.

The Czech Music Festival, normally held in February, has been cancelled for this year and our 10k, normally held in March, has been postponed to an undetermined date. So again, we're looking at spending \$3,600 plus a month to be closed.

Thanks to our anonymous donor, member donations, and Monday night dinners, we are surviving.

February Red Letter Days


February 16, 1862 -- February 14, 1865

Sokol was founded on February 16, 1862 in Prague by Dr. Miroslav Tyrš and Jindrich Fügner. The name Sokol was chosen as it is the Czech word for falcon, a courageous, agile bird, fast and high flying. Dr. Miroslav Tyrš was a Czech art historian and educator. His poor physical condition in his youth gave him an interest in sports to strengthen himself, and he came to create a system of physical training based on the Greek ideal of "kalokagathia" (in ancient Greece, an ideal physical and moral beauty) applying those principles of harmony of body and mind in this new organization. Hence Sokol's motto, "A Sound Mind in a Sound Body." The Sokol Tyrš System offered physical training utilizing gymnastics apparatus and other athletic strength and agility training techniques that required discipline of body and mind.

Jindrich Fügner, born in Prague, was a businessman of German ethnic origin, but cast aside the social and economic benefits that his German ethnic heritage would have brought him. Instead, he chose to adopt the growing nationalist movement of the Czechs and combined efforts with Tyrš. His business sense for organization proved important for the new organization. He introduced the members' habit of calling each other brother and sister. Fügner died in 1865, only three years after the founding of Sokol. But the group of outstanding men that he assembled to lead Sokol enabled the young organization to flourish after his death.

The early to mid 1800s was a time in Central Europe when a fervor of nationalism was growing. This desire for an independent state based on ethnicity, separate from the Austro-Hungarian Empire, was strong in the Czech regions of Bohemia, Moravia and Slovakia. Sokol members' patriotism and dedication to the creation of an independent Czech state was evident from the very beginning. Sokol quickly became a Czech nationalist gathering point, attracting thousands of participants. Sokol units made trips in national costumes (Kroj) to national ceremonies, public exercises, etc, to show their patriotism.

Bohemian and Moravian immigrants to the USA brought Sokol with them. On February 14, 1865, the first Sokol in the USA was organized in St. Louis, Missouri. Sokol continues to provide gymnastics training, cultural awareness and family oriented activities. At the close of every gymnastics class, the instructor calls out, "Na Zdar!" which is the Czech word for, "To Success!" The students then answer, "Zdar!" which replies simply, "Success!"



A current history of Sokol in America including a list of active and past units in the USA. Robert Tomanek, a lifelong Sokol, has compiled an accurate history based on historical documents from many sources. A must have for every Sokol member and supporter. You will be proud of the history of the Czech immigrants that expanded the Sokol idea of physical fitness in the USA since 1865.

Today we continue to bring these principles of A Sound Mind in a Sound Body as a worthy Goal.

SAVE THE POOL

The current pool was built in 1972. There has not been any major renovation done to the pool except for maintenance and in recent years, painting, patching, and replacement of pumps and motors. Sad to say, but the pool is in dire need of repair!!!! We solicited quotes from four reputable pool companies to bid on resurfacing the inside of the pool, repair the coping around the pool, and to replace the underwater lights. As you can imagine, the cost is not cheap. Since COVID, we have not had the cash flow for this kind of renovation project. This project is needing a minimum of \$75,000 in order to restore the pool.

We are soliciting donations, sponsors, ideas for fundraisers, and anyone willing to help with this endeavor. Due to the current condition of the pool and the uncertainty of COVID this year, we are unsure the pool will be able to open this summer. This does provide us with an excellent opportunity to make the necessary renovations if funds are raised within the next couple of months. Featured film: "To the Woods" at 7pm


Old members, new members, friends and neighbors are all invited to the showing of the 2012 Czech movie:


