In about 70 days, representatives of all American Sokol units will be converging on Ennis, Texas by airplane and automobile to participate in the American Sokol's quadrennial National Convention. The Convention is the supreme governing body of the organization and is responsible for charting the organization's future for the next 4 years -- national officers are elected, a financial budget is established, bylaws are revised as needed, and the direction of the organization moving forward is established.

Given the current COVID situation, the Executive Board has put convention COVID protocols and masking policies in place to provide as safe an environment as possible for attending delegates. Social distancing is also a consideration. The officers and members of Sokol Karel Havlicek Borovsky (KHB) are working hard to prepare and welcome the delegates with some real Texas hospitality. Their best meal planners and cooks are ready to provide superb meal service. There are many volunteer opportunities available. Contact KHB leadership.

Pre-convention committees have also already been at work. These committees have met virtually, made plans for the next 4 years, and provided their financial needs to the Convention Budget & Finance Committee, which has crunched the numbers and compiled a preliminary budget. This preliminary budget proposal has been distributed to all unit presidents and convention delegates for review and additional input.

The Convention Bylaws Committee has worked through all the suggested revisions and prepared a preliminary set of Bylaws with recommended changes. This preliminary set of recommended, revised bylaws with rationale has also been distributed to all unit presidents and convention delegates. Educational Director's Report Two Czech Easter Traditions

Easter in the Czech Republic is a fun time. One of the traditions that the Czechs brought with them to the USA are the ornately decorated eggs – kraslice. Painting and decorating eggs for Easter is a worldwide tradition, but the Slavs take it to a whole other level. Their intricate designs used to decorate eggs have made Czech *kraslice* famous around the world.



Decorated eggs (kraslice) are one of the best-known and most widely practiced Czech Easter traditions. Girls typically decorate the eggs to be hung in windows, put in baskets or given to the boys who whip them on Easter Monday. (*That's another tradition. See below.*)

There are many Easter egg decorating techniques and the more elaborate ones require a certain level of skill. Different materials can be used, such as bee's wax, straw, watercolors, onion peels, picture stickers. The most common designs are geometrical patterns, but you can also see flowers, leaves or snowflake patterns in a whole range of colors. There are no limitations to creating pretty, colorful eggs. A nationwide Easter egg contest is held in Prague and other Czech cities around Easter time.



In the past, Sokol has had kraslice classes here in Ennis and at Sokol Dallas. Hopefully, we will be able to start those again next year.



About the whips: Boys make an Easter whip (pomlázka) by braiding young pussy willow twigs together and tying colorful ribbons on the end. They go carolling around town on Easter Monday, looking to (softly) whip girls on their backsides. This gesture is a "blessing" for fertility. Then the girl gives the boy a decorated egg in thanks. Getting whipped is a sign of popularity, like seeing who gets the most Valentine cards. The whipping is supposed to be a "love pat," not an audition for the home run hall of fame, although some young boys get

carried away with their swing. Now-a-days, very "interesting" pomlázky can be purchased, and make a good souvenir. This tradition didn't catch on well here in the USA.

Czech Movie & Social - April 7


