Educational Director's Report Good King Wenceslaus was Czech

The statue of the knight on horseback in Wenceslaus Square in Prague, Czech Republic – that is Saint King Wenceslaus. It signifies the importance Czechs place on this early Slavic hero. Wenceslaus was the Duke of Bohemia and was brutally murdered by his younger brother's companions in 935 AD. Although Wenceslaus was only a duke during his lifetime, Holy Roman Emperor Otto I posthumously conferred the title of "king" on Wenceslaus, which is why he is referred to as "king" in legend and song.

Wenceslaus was the son of Vratislaus I, Duke of Bohemia of the Přemyslid dynasty. His grandfather had been converted to Christianity by Cyril and Methodius. His mother, Drahomíra, was the daughter of a pagan tribal chief who was baptized at the time of her marriage to Wenceslaus' father, but she never really acted in a Christian manner.

When Wenceslaus assumed his dukedom, he used Christianity to strengthen his state. "Great Moravia" was the first major state that was

predominantly West Slavic to emerge in Central Europe. It included the area known as Czechoslovakia, and possibly areas of present day Hungary, Austria, Germany, Poland, Romania, Serbia and Ukraine.

In September 935, a group of nobles allied with Wenceslaus's younger brother, Boleslav, plotted to kill Wenceslaus. Three of Boleslav's companions stabbed the duke to death. It is said that as the duke fell, Boleslav ran him through with a lance. Wenceslaus was immediately considered a martyr and saint.

He was so loved because of his generosity, as legend relates: "...rising every night from his noble bed, with bare feet and only one chamberlain, he went around to God's churches and gave alms generously to widows, orphans, those in prison and afflicted by every difficulty."

The hymn "Svatý Václave" (Saint Wenceslaus) or "Saint Wenceslaus Chorale" is one of the oldest known Czech songs. Traceable to the 12th century AD, it is still among the most popular religious songs in the Bohemian lands.

This is how we picture King Wenceslaus now in keeping with the Christmas carol:

Good King Wenceslas looked out On the Feast of Stephen When the snow lay round about Deep and crisp and even Brightly shone the moon that night Though the frost was cruel When a poor man came in sight Gathering winter fuel

Hither, page, and stand by me, If thou knowst it, telling Yonder peasant, who is he? Where and what his dwelling? Sire, he lives a good league hence, Underneath the mountain Right against the forest fence By Saint Agnes fountain.



Sire, the night is darker now
And the wind blows stronger
Fails my heart, I know not how
I can go no longer.
Mark my footsteps, good my page
Tread thou in them boldly
Thou shall find the winters rage
Freeze thy blood less coldly.

In his masters step he trod
Where the snow lay dinted
Heat was in the very sod
Which the Saint had printed
Therefore, Christian men, be sure
Wealth or rank possessing
Ye, who now will bless the poor
Shall yourselves find blessing.








Monthly Czech Movie & Social Dec 15th & Jan 5th

The featured film is "Silent Barricade" at 7pm (Czech title: "Nemá barikáda"). About the film: May 1945, Russians are approaching Berlin & German troops in Prague are slowly beginning their retreat of the city while committing atrocities along the way. The situation escalates when a tram gets shot at by passing German cars & innocent citizens get killed. The natives immediately decide to block off one of the main bridges, preventing the German's smooth escape. The entire city is suddenly organizing the defense. As is typical for Czechoslovak movies filmed after 1948, also this film is heavily tainted by Communist propaganda, which is significantly skewing the reality & making it historically inaccurate.
