Educational Director's Report

In French, it's Mardi Gras. In Brazil, it's Carnival. In English, it's Fat Tuesday or Shrove Tuesday. In the Czech Republic, it's Masopust. But wherever you are, the days leading up to the beginning of Lenten season on Ash Wednesday are filled with costumes, parades, singing, dancing, eating and drinking. Masopust translates to 'meat fast' in Old Czech and is the celebration of spring, burial of winter, and feasting as the last chance to eat and drink in excess before Lenten fasting begins on Ash Wednesday.

A common feature of Masopust, Mardi Gras and Carnival are parades and the wearing of masks. Popular masks are devils, death, clowns, and practically any animal under the sun. This year, Ash Wednesday falls on March 2, so the evening of March 1 is the culmination of festivities. The main Masopust celebration begins on Sunday with dinner, followed by dancing and entertainment. In Prague and many towns, bright and early on Monday morning, masqueraders and musicians meet in the village square and then parade around the village, complete with noisemakers, of course. Tuesday, the day before Ash Wednesday, is called masopustní úterý (masopust Tuesday). On that day, parades continue around the town, ending with a festive dance at an inn. The women of the village may have baked a large decorated pastry wreath which will be shared.

Masopust celebrations were discouraged or forbidden under Czechoslovakia's communist regime, but the holiday has become popular again since the 1990s.

Building Upgrades

A few members came together January 28 and 29 to make a few improvements to the hall. First was installing a new 82-inch Smart Television in the club room. It was paid for by donations for the members. Michelle Slovak took the lead to collect donations and purchase the television. The new television replaces one of the existing that will be on the patio enhancing viewing of sporting events and Czech Movie Night. Now we can get Ranger baseball games this season on the Smart TV.

The most notable improvement to the hall is painting the stage a marron color. Ryan Waedekin of Sherman Williams Paint Store in Ennis donated paint and supplies for this and few more projects. The lower wall in the service area was painted a brown color and the rest of service area lower walls will be painted at another date.

The crew rented a scissor lift to help with the painting and replace 39 ceiling tiles that fell victim to volleyballs gaining altitude at a high velocity. We recently had an Ellis County fire inspection and were required to replace the broken tiles. Ceiling tiles help slow the migration of smoke in the event of a fire.

More painting projects and upgrades are in the plans. Watch for a "Call for Volunteers" so you can help too!



Picture 2 – One lower wall in the service area was painted brown. The remaining service aera lower walls will be painted in the near future.


Picture 3 – 39 ceiling tiles were replaced in the volleyball aera of the gym.




