Educational Director's Report

Local Sokol Leaders Lawrence "Larry" Laznovsky 1945 -- 2011

This is the first in a series about our local Sokols who were instrumental in keeping the Sokol and Czech spirit alive here. These articles will reminisce for our older members and introduce our newer members to those who dedicated their lives to this organization. Gymnastics was the founding element of Sokol, and adult men actively participated in gymnastics. Unfortunately, that is no longer the case in this area.

Larry Laznovsky was born into Sokol, the son of Frank A. (also a Sokol KHB unit president) and Mary A. (Trojacek) Laznovsky. He grew up in Ennis and graduated from Ennis High School in 1963. By then he had already been coaching gymnastics here in Ennis since his early teens. Many of us can remember warming up for gym to his favorite exercises: jumping jacks and arm circles. At the young age of 17, he became the Sokol Ennis Men's Physical Director. He soon went on to serve as the Men's Director and President of Southern District of American Sokol.





During the 1969 National Slet in Chicago, he met Lillian Vesely. Soon after, they married and they made their home in Ennis. Larry and Lil spent many years coaching and mentoring young athletes and traveling the world together. They attended and participated in numerous gymnastics activities nationwide and worldwide: ASO Slets, Canadian Slets, COS Slets, Sokol USA Slets, ASO Conventions, World Gymnaestradas, and USAG National GymFests.

For decades, Larry was the face of Sokol Ennis. He was not simply the President of Sokol KHB Ennis for 28 years, he served on Sokol boards at the national and international levels as well as for several Czech cultural organizations.



In 1990 after the end of the Communist era, Larry, along with a contingent of American

Sokol leadership, traveled to Prague, Czechoslovakia, where they were instrumental in re-establishing the Czech Sokol in its founding country and founded the World Sokol Federation, where he served as Vice President of that new organization. Larry served as the American Sokol Organization (ASO) National President from 2000-2010. For his lifelong contributions to Sokol, Larry was awarded

the ASO's TG Masaryk Award posthumously in 2017.


