IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR SPECIAL INTEREST VEHICLE REGISTRATION CONCESSION

Queensland Transport has recently completed a review of the Special Interest Vehicle (SIV) Registration Concession Scheme. This was initiated by submissions from the Queensland Combined Council of Historic Vehicle Clubs on behalf of their members and other interested parties. The purpose of the review was to investigate requests to extend the conditions of the concession while maintaining the integrity of the scheme.

Approved changes to the existing scheme are the inclusion of incorporated historical societies as a person eligible for the concession and an avenue for operators to drive their SIV vehicles when moving house. Operators may apply to a QT office for a letter of authorisation prior to their journey providing proof of change of residence is established.

Clarification was also sought on the issue of "road testing". This clarification has been added to the list of conditions of use below. It will continue to be a condition for a vehicle registered under the SIV scheme that you are a current member of an incorporated car club or association. It is also reminded that your vehicle usage is limited to:

- Participating in rallies organised by incorporated car clubs;
- ✓ Participating in processions for which a Special Events Permit has been issued under the *Transport Operations (Road Use Management Accreditation and Other Provisions) Regulation 2005.*
- Exhibiting the vehicle in displays, fetes or similar functions conducted for religious, charitable or educational purposes.
- Ceremonial purposes (weddings, formals) involving immediate family members provided this is not done for fee or reward. Immediate family means parents, grandparents, sons, daughters, grandchildren but not extended family relationships such as nephews and nieces etc
- Preparing for, proceeding to, and returning from the above activities.
- Travel in order to have the vehicle repaired. There is no distance restriction in these circumstances however such travel must be reasonable and openly justified by the vehicle operator.
- Road testing within a 15 kilometre radius from the place where the vehicle is garaged. The purpose of the travel must be to road test the vehicle following repair or restoration and not for any other purpose. The vehicle cannot also be used as a means of transport.
- Buses are permitted to carry non-fare paying passengers for journeys (joy-rides) from an event (e.g. fete) and return provided the length of the journey does not exceed 5 kilometres. Payment of any kind cannot be made for these journeys.
- Heavy vehicles over 4.5 tonnes gross vehicle mass (GVM) are permitted to carry a load provided the loaded GVM or gross combination mass (GCM) does not exceed 50% of the maximum permitted mass for the vehicle configuration. This mass is based on the lesser of:
 - 1 Individual Axle ratings;
- 2 Tyre Manufacturers limits;
- 3 Manufacturers GVM or GCM;
- 4 Regulation Mass Limits

The load carried must be in relation to or part of the reason for the vehicle's use under the scheme.

The Special Interest Vehicle Guide has been updated and is available on Queensland Transport's website www.transport.qld.gov.au. Alternatively you may request a printed copy from your nearest Queensland Transport Customer Service Centre.

Dear Technical Support:

Last year I upgraded from Girlfriend 7.0 to **Wife 1.0**. I soon noticed that the new program began unexpected child processing that took up a lot of space and valuable resources.

In addition, <u>Wife 1.0</u> installed itself into all other programs and now monitors all other system activity. Applications such as **Poker Night 10.3**, **Football 5.0**, **Hunting and Fishing 7.5**, and **Golf 3.6** were also affected.

I can't seem to keep <u>Wife 1.0</u> in the background while attempting to run my favorite applications. I'm thinking about going back to <u>Girlfriend 7.0</u>, but the uninstall doesn't work on **Wife 1.0** ... Please help!

Dear Troubled User:	

This is a very common problem that men complain about.

Many people upgrade from Girlfriend 7.0 to <u>Wife 1.0</u>, thinking that it is just a Utilities and Entertainment program. <u>Wife 1.0</u> is an **OPERATING SYSTEM** and is designed by its Creator to run **EVERYTHING!!!** It is also impossible to delete <u>Wife 1.0</u> and to return to **Girlfriend 7.0**. It is impossible to uninstall, or purge the program files from the system once installed.

You cannot go back to **Girlfriend 7.0** because <u>Wife 1.0</u> is designed to not allow this. Look in your <u>Wife 1.0</u> manual under <u>Warnings-Alimony/Child Support</u>. I recommend that you keep <u>Wife 1.0</u> and work on improving the situation. I suggest installing the background application 'Yes Dear' to alleviate software augmentation.

The best course of action is to enter the command **C:\APOLOGIZE!** because ultimately you will have to give the APOLOGIZE command before the system will return to normal anyway.
