Thought Exchange & "Meet the Candidates" for Lakota School Board

- SEL standards have been set in the state of Ohio for the 5 competencies per grade band (see referenced web page).
- Goal is to promote positivity and suicide prevention

Presentation by Lakota Outreach, Diversity, & Inclusion: Mr. Elgin Card, Director, Aisha Moore, and Leah Aguilar

Mr. Card:

- We want all kids to feel welcome no matter how they worship, where they're from, what they look like, or who they love.
- The way each school incorporates the work of LODI is different.
- District is 38% non-white with 27/1066 teachers of color and 80/711 support staff of color. Kids need to see people like themselves in these jobs.
- DEI groups at all 7-12 buildings
- We do not teach critical race theory, never have, but culturally responsive teaching is different. That is a focus on empathy and awareness of others' beliefs and cultures.
- We all have certain unconscious biases and we should talk about them. LODI works to help students appreciate that we all come from different cultures and we should learn about them and how they influence our frame of reference; that doesn't mean we all have to agree.

Ms. Moore:

- Diversity also means special needs, gender identity, race, and more.
- We have champions at each building some have 3-4.
- The focus at this point is a book study around trauma and trauma-informed learning so
 that we can all be better prepared to work with students no matter where they are and
 what they've experienced.

Ms. Aguilar:

- Her focus is parent engagement and community outreach, part of LODI & student services.
- Fanfares are happening again this year, albeit outside. See district calendar for more info.

- Mental health therapists in every building, therapy dogs present when possible.
