"Additional nominations of eligible members may be submitted to the Secretary in writing and accompanied by the written acceptance of each additional nominee stating their willingness to be a candidate and endorsed by three members in good standing. Such nominations must be received by the Secretary no later than June 30th.

DUES ARE DUE

CHANGES IN THE AKC SCENT WORK PROGRAM

After my girl Becka retired from agility, we tried both rally and nosework. Becka was a natural at nosework (whereas neither of us was a natural at rally ha ha). I believe that nosework is a great way to strengthen teamwork with your dog and can even help dogs with environmental sensitivities (like Becka had). We're seeing more trials in Texas and Oklahoma hosted by several organizations including NASCW (National Association of Canine Scent Work), UKC, and AKC. An AKC Scent Work trial was offered in association with the ABTC National in 2018 for the first time and I hope that's a trend.


The AKC Scent Work program includes handler discrimination (finding the owner's scent) and the following elements: containers, buried hides, exteriors, and interiors. Competitors may elect to enter any or all of the events offered at a trial. Many competitors in AKC's Scent Work program had concerns about the higher levels of the buried element where dogs were required to find target odor buried in the ground. The AKC heard those concerns and changes have been approved. Beginning in October, all buried hides will be in a container with play sand or water. The addition of creative distractors will increase the difficulty at the higher levels. Distractors may be food (in a container), toys, auditory stimuli, a person in the search area, and others.
