

Sanskrit "antar" = intestines

Greek "enteron" = intestines

Latin "intero" = intestines

Latin "intro" = toward the inside

IndoEuropean "wer" = worm

IndoEuropean "wert" = to turn or twist

Latin "vertere" = to turn
