



"The German Midwife" by Mandy Robotham, Historical Fiction, December 2018

This story started out slow for me, but once it got going it was hard to put down. Setting is 1944, World War II. A young Jewish German midwife is sent to a Nazi prison camp to aid Jewish mothers with childbirth. Reading horrors of labor and birth here are not for the squeamish; the book has 4 detailed labors, most with tragic outcomes. Due to her excellent reputation, midwife Anke is suddenly summoned from hell to the luxurious mountaintop mansion of Hitler and his mistress, to care for the pregnant Eva Braun. Incredibly, amidst the Nazi setting, romance blooms with an SS officer with a heart (fiction remember.) Suspense, inhumanity of Nazis, fear for survival, and caring emotions radiate through the author's very excellent writing.

Like French Fries but do not want to fry with all that oil. I have made these several times and because they are done in the oven with very little oil or salt, can be eaten literally guilt free. They are crispy on the outside and tender in the middle. I cut this recipe by half which serves plenty for two.

This serves 4 people.

4 russet potatoes (6-8 oz. ea.) peeled and cut into 1/2 inch thick fries

6 tbsp. canola or vegetable oil

1 tbsp. cornstarch

1 tsp. salt

Place potatoes in a microwave safe bowl. Wrap tightly with plastic and nuke about 3-5 minutes. About halfway through shake bowl to redistribute potatoes. Transfer to a cooling rack. (The recipe calls to blot the potatoes with a paper towel but I just let them cool and find no need to dry them. Also I place parchment paper on the rack so they don't stick), Preheat oven to 450 degrees. Heat oil in a rimmed baking sheet for about 5-7 minutes. Meanwhile, whisk remaining oil (1 tbsp.) with the cornstarch and salt in a large bowl. Add potatoes, toss to coat. Arrange on the cooking sheet in a single layer. Bake until deep golden brown and crisp, 25 - 35 minutes. Flipping half way through cooking time. Transfer to a paper towel lined plate, blot any existing oil if necessary. Serve.

Andy just graduated from Toyan Middle School and will be attending Calaveras High School. Also pictured is Boris, the new puppy.


Judy and Ron Huckaby's Grandson
