


SUNSHINE...Carolyn Edwards










SOCIAL...Judy Bruenn 772-3555

Baked Blooming Onion with Gruyere Cheese

Preheat oven to 375 degrees.

Trim tops and bottoms off 2 jumbo onions, leaving roots intact. Peel. Cut each onion from top to root into 12 wedges without cutting through root. Place side by side in an ovenproof baking dish that holds them snugly; fan out onion petals.

In a small bowl, whisk 1 TBSP extra-virgin olive oil, 1 TBSP dry white wine, 1 tsp minced garlic, and ½ tsp minced fresh rosemary. Pour over open onion petals; sprinkle with ½ tsp kosher salt and ¼ tsp freshly ground black pepper.

Cover dish with foil. Bake 1-1/2 hours or until onions are tender. Uncover and sprinkle with ½ cup grated Gruyere cheese; bake 10 minutes or until cheese melts. Garnish with fresh rosemary leaves. Serve hot with toasted baguette slices. Serves 6.

"Ladies Room" by Carolyn Brown, 2012 - Wall Street Journal Best Seller

This is a funny, sometimes hilarious, sometimes poignant, story of a middle-aged married woman and how her life changes drastically after what she hears from the stall in the Ladies room while her two cousins gossip about her, and she learns about her cheating husband. They are attending a funeral for their elderly aunt, and along with her reactions to the gossip she heard, the other part of the story is that the aunt has left her old, broken down home to "Trudy". She is thereafter determined to break free from her bland, go along, people pleasing characteristics, face tough situations courageously and begin to make choices that she herself wants.
