Heart and Soul has set up a website to look at the items and also to sign up and pay. The link is at the end of this email.



A Piece of the World - By Christina Baker Kline, 2017

Here, the acclaimed author of **Orphan Train** offers an insightful look at the relationships between Artist Andrew Wyeth, and his muse, Christina Olson, her brother Al, and their storied and lonely home. Painstakingly researched, that setting is informed by generations of family history, (traced tragically to Salem) by insights into Christina's physical and emotional challenges, and by the intensity of the artist's desire to capture and present truth. That truth is most famously realized in the well-known Wyeth painting, Christina's World. As that world gradually and painfully shrunk, the artist's skill and renown grew, with his wife (and Christina's good friend) helping to manage the complex relationship between the art world and the very private muse.
