### COTTON TO MARKET (BRAND DEVELOPMENT) AND THE BETTER COTTON INITATIVE

Hamish McIntyre, Chair of Cotton Australia, Local Producer.



Hamish runs an irrigation and dryland farming, cattle breeding and feedlot business in the St George, Dirranbandi & Quilpie districts of SW Queensland. McIntyre Agriculture Pty Ltd grows 3,000ha of irrigated crops including BMP certified and BCI eligible cotton, mung beans,

sunflowers, corn and occasionally watermelons. 17,000 ha of dryland country is planted to grain, pulse and forage crops and an Angus breeding herd grazes the backgrounding country. The Feedlot value adds cattle and commodities produced on farm.

Hamish is a trained agronomist and also has a certificate in Cotton Production from UNE. He is a graduate of the Australian Rural Leadership Foundation and the Trailblazers Program. Currently Hamish is the Chair of Cotton Australia and sits on the Better Cotton Initiative (BCI) Council, based in Geneva.
