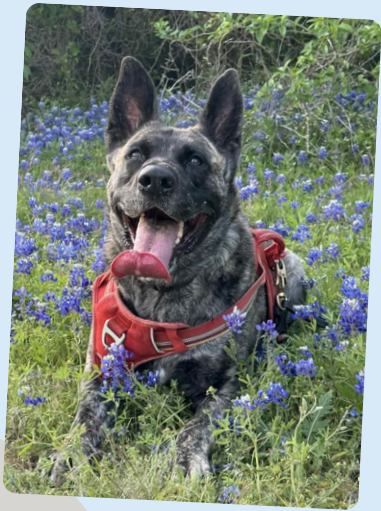
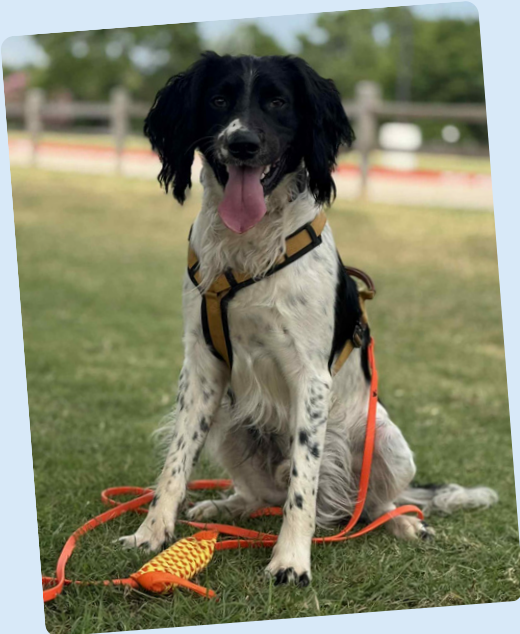

WHAT DO I DO?

1. **CALL 911**
2. **BE SPECIFIC** about information
 - a. **WHEN** and **WHERE** were they last seen? Address?
 - b. **WHAT** were they wearing? Be as descriptive as you can!
 - c. Name, age, height, weight, any medical conditions
 - d. Phone number where you can be reached
 - e. **ASK FOR K9 TRACKERS TO BE CALLED** and give them our phone number:

(240)216-4238

3. Have your **Scent Collection Kit** and **Identification Card** ready when Police and Search Team arrive.
4. Look in and around the house for any possible hiding spots.
5. Notify your neighbors and ask if anyone has seen them.
6. Post and share on social media.
7. Have someone stay at the house to meet with law enforcement, the search team, or just in case they wander home.
8. Breathe.

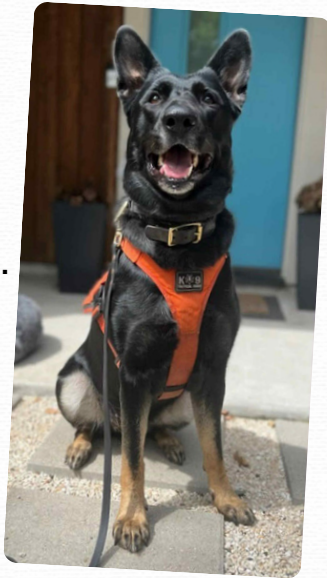

WHAT CAN I DO?

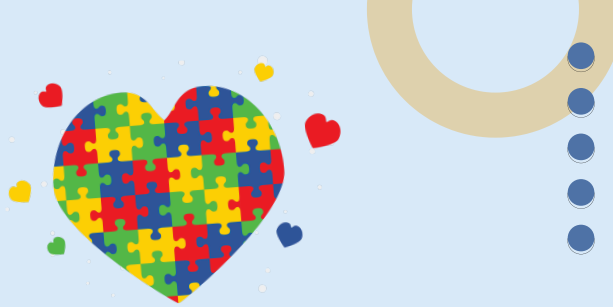
It is scary when someone we love goes missing. Even when you have done everything you can to prevent it, the inevitable happens.
