Once again, your Commissioners Court cut the County tax rate below the "No New Revenue Rate" and provided a real tax cut for taxpayers. Construction is well underway on the new state-of-the-art Mental Health Wellness Center that includes an extended observation unit and respite unit that will serve as a critical part of addressing mental health challenges in Galveston County. We also continue to reduce the public debt, which has been reduced by XX% since 2017, while still investing in infrastructure for our future and maintaining reserves for potential natural disasters.

I am so grateful for the groundswell of support and want to thank each and every one of you for putting your trust in me.
