Was It A Winter Wonderland?

Or a frigid nightmare? The photo above was taken at the 64 acre park off 10th Street in Bacliff looking out at the playground and pavilion. The snow and ice prompted a few folks to practice their slick pavement driving in the parking lot which EPP thinks is a great idea. The opportunity to practice safely on ice and snow is pretty rare in Galveston County. While there were a few power blips, few actually had any noticeable outages. Whether that was luck or good planning and maintenance by Centerpoint and Ercot is certainly debatable based on history, but the stable power supply was certainly a benefit.

There was something akin to panic buying before the cold weather swept in as grocery store parking lots were packed and the shelves were being stripped bare. That indicates that pre-planning for potential weather disruptions likely needs a bit of improvement. EPP reminds its readers that if it has not already been done, it is time to have fuel in the car, flashlight batteries, non-perishable foods, alternate cooking and heating methods and medication on hand in adequate quantities to last at least a few days if the roads are icy, businesses are closed and the power is off.

Doing the chore of testing chainsaws, generators and etc. is a pain, but not as much pain as finding they don't work when you need them. Car batteries, riding lawn mower batteries and those in golf carts and other lead acid batteries do not fare well if they are not fully charged when the temperature drops. Battery chargers and maintainers can keep vehicles operational and batteries not needing replacement. Money spent up front can save in the long run.

Based on local observation, it seems that dripping faucets and insulating exposed plumbing saved most people from leaks that often flood houses and yards when the ice in burst pipes thaws and starts flowing. Important to remember that insulation does not create heat, it only holds existing heat. That means that an insulated pipe exposed to extended below freezing temperatures can still freeze and break if there is no water flowing at an adequate pace or no external heat source. If that insulated pipe does freeze, the insulation will delay its thawing when the weather warms, so leaks may not be apparent immediately upon a rise in temperature.

Cops, firefighters and utility workers were not able to hunker down. They continued to respond to calls for service and EPP thanks all of them for doing what needed to be done even when conditions were not pleasant. February and March are often the coldest times of year in Galveston County, so if this cold snap was a frigid nightmare and not a winter wonderland for any readers, consider it a wakeup call to get things squared away before the next cold front rolls in.



Chicken Continental

3 or 4 lbs frying size chickens, cut up 1/3 cup seasoned flour 1/4 cup shortening 1 can cream of chicken soup 2 1/2 tbsp grated onion Dash of pepper 1/2 tsp celery flakes 1/2 tsp paprika 1 tsp salt 1 tbsp minced parsley 1/8 tsp thyme 1 1/3 cups water 1 1/3 cups Minute Rice or partially cooked white or brown rice **Paprika**

Roll chicken in seasoned flour and saute' shortening until tender. Combine soup, onion and seasonings in saucepan, gradually add water and blend thoroughly. Bring to a boil, stirring constantly. Reserve 1/3 cup of the soup mixture. Pour the remaining soup over Minute Rice in a shallow casserole. Stir just to moisten all of the rice. Top with chicken and the remaining soup. Cover and bake at 350 degrees for 20 to 25 minutes. Sprinkle with paprika.

Note: The brown rice gives a rich nutty flavor and is a nice change.




You will need the pole number and address or cross streets as well as some personal information. If you choose, they will send you email updates on the repair status. It is easy and helps keep our neighborhoods safer.







This week's Galveston County Animal Resource Center Pet of the Week is Chelsea.





San Leon Volunteer Fire Department: A Legacy of Service Since 1955

The San Leon Volunteer Fire Department (SLVFD) has proudly served our community for 70 years, and its rich history reflects the spirit of resilience and determination that defines San Leon.

The Beginning

Before 1955, fire protection for San Leon, Bayview, and Bacliff was provided by the Bacliff Volunteer Fire Department (BVFD). Volunteer firefighters from San Leon traveled to Bacliff to respond to local emergencies, but the distance proved to be a challenge. Recognizing the need for localized fire protection, a group of dedicated firefighters petitioned to form a new department. In February 1955, their request was granted, and the San Leon Volunteer Fire Department was officially chartered by the State of Texas.

As part of the agreement, SLVFD received one fire truck, 100 feet of hose, a nozzle, and a siren. The department's first station was a modest tin building, no larger than a two-car garage, located just blocks from Galveston Bay. Despite these humble beginnings, the department was determined to grow and serve.

Building a Legacy

In 1959, SLVFD purchased its first new fire truck, a 750 GPM pumper from American LaFrance, and began planning for a more permanent fire station. After Hurricane Carla devastated the Texas coast in 1961, a "gentleman's agreement" with the County Commissioners allowed the department to build a new station on county park property. The community rallied together, donating materials, labor, and funds to construct a concrete, three-bay fire station with a meeting room and kitchen.

In 1968, the Ladies Auxiliary gifted the department a new FireFox pumper, which served SLVFD until its retirement in 1994. During the early 1970s, the station was expanded with a 2,500-square-foot metallic addition, creating more space for equipment storage and fundraisers.

Securing the Future

In 2004, after years of uncertainty regarding property ownership, the 212th District Court in Galveston ruled in favor of SLVFD, granting full ownership of the 2.6-acre tract where the fire station still stands today.

A Glimpse into the Past

An iconic photo captures three generations of fire trucks in front of the station shortly after it was built: the department's original fire truck (received upon secession from BVFD), the 1959 American LaFrance, and the 1968 FireFox. These trucks represent the growth and progress of the department, a testament to the dedication of the firefighters and the unwavering support of the San Leon community.

From its humble beginnings to its current operations, the San Leon Volunteer Fire Department's history is a story of neighbors coming together to protect and serve. This year, as SLVFD celebrates its 70th anniversary, we honor the visionaries, volunteers, and community members who built this department and continue to sustain it today.
