

What is a house shut off valve?

A house shut off valve (pictured below) is a valve that's typically found on the side of your home where the water line comes in. While not all homes have a house shut off valve, it's a very important valve if you do have one: if closed, this valve will turn off all water service to the home! While this is handy to take care of any repairs you may need to address inside the home, during the summertime many people accidentally turn the house shut off valve when trying to turn off hoses or sprinklers. If you're experiencing a loss of service, always be sure to check your house shut off valve because it might be the culprit!



Peach Cobbler

2 tsp. baking powder 1 1/2 c. sugar

3/4 c. milk 4 or 5 fresh peaches

1/2 c. water

Melt oleo in baking dish. Mix flour, baking powder, 1 c. sugar,

and milk.

Pour into the baking dish. Peel and slice peaches, arrange over batter. Sprinkle remaining 1/2 c. sugar over peaches. Pour water over peaches.

Bake in pre-heated oven at 350 degrees for 50 minutes.
















From State Senator Mayes Middleton


