Republicans For A Democrat?

In Galveston County a strange but understandable phenomena has begun. Staunch Republicans have stated their support for a local candidate running on the Democratic ticket. It is actually not surprising that this involves the race for Sheriff between Jimmy Fullen and Mark Salinas. Jimmy Fullen won the Republican primary over the much better qualified and respected candidate Ray Nolen. - The CERT Program educates citizens about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact their area and trains them in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations. Using the training learned in the classroom and during exercises, CERT members can assist others in their neighborhood or workplace following an event when professional responders are not immediately available to help.

CERT members also are encouraged to support emergency response agencies by taking a more active role in emergency preparedness projects in their community. All citizens are encouraged to take the CERT training. There is no requirement to join the active CERT team. Our philosophy is that a trained citizen is a better-prepared citizen.

Chicken Continental

1/3 cup all-purpose flour
salt and freshly ground black pepper or Lawry's seasoned salt, to taste
1 broiler-fryer chicken (3 lbs.), cut up
4 tbsps. (1/2 stick) butter
1 can (10.5 oz) cream of chicken, celery, or mushroom soup
2 1/2 tbsps. finely minced onion
1 tbsp. finely chopped parsley
1 tsp. salt
1/2 tsp. celery flakes
1/8 tsp. dried thyme
dash of freshly ground black pepper
1 1/3 cups Minute Rice

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

Combine flour and salt and pepper in a resealable plastic bag. Add chicken pieces, a few at a time, and shake to coat.

Melt butter in a skillet over medium heat. Add chicken and cook until browned on both sides. Transfer chicken to a baking sheet. Add chicken soup, onions, parsley, salt, celery flakes, thyme, pepper and 1 1/3 cups water to chicken drippings in skillet. Heat to boiling, stirring constantly.

Spread rice in a shallow 1 1/2 qt. casserole. Reserve 1/3 cup soup mixture. Pour remainder over rice and stir to moisten. Place cooked chicken on rice. Pour reserved soup mixture over chicken. Bake for 45 minutes.

Makes 4 servings.

Exposure to the high heat encountered when a raging fire is lit inside a mostly sealed shipping container provides an opportunity for the firefighters to get "comfortable" in an environment they will be exposed to when called upon to enter a structure fire. Additionally, a class on wildland firefighting was a part of this training exercise to enhance the understanding of the characteristics and methods of dealing with vegetative based fires.

With both these local departments relying on volunteers to respond in times of need, the working relationship between the two departments is critical to meeting the manpower and equipment demands that may arise. Future joint training events will further enhance the teamwork that was evident at this literal hot box activity. Both departments and likely every volunteer department can always use more people. Spillway Park Lighting Update

During a recent assessment of lighting at Spillway Park, EPP noted that there are still only two of the four parking lot light fixtures operational on the lone parking lot light pole. This represents a many months long ongoing failure of the parks director/destroyer Julie Diaz. She clearly has no shame when it comes to the safety of the community that uses this potentially wonderful park. EPP went a little further and discovered that there are nine area/security lights located around the park of which one is functional and that is seemingly unintentional as it also burns during daylight hours. It has been reported in these pages with accompanying photos the difference in lighting between Spillway Park and Carbide Park where the parks department is headquartered. Some have begun to suggest that Julie Diaz is simply refusing to do her job in the Bayshore (and elsewhere) to stick a thumb in the eye of the Eagle Point Press for daring to bring these issues to the public. While that is not confirmed, it would certainly justify her dismissal from a position that has duties she is clearly unwilling or unable to perform. The community can count on EPP to keep the focus on the terrible state of so many of our Galveston County Parks. EPP will be soon reporting on the failing and failed lighting at the relatively new 64 acre park located off of 10th Street in Bacliff.

Galveston County Road and Bridge’s Department will start the 2nd and final pass the week of August 19, 2024.

IT MOST LIKELY WILL TAKE WEEKS TO REMOVE THE REMAINING DEBRIS FROM RESIDENTIAL PROPERTIES. COUNTY CREWS WILL NOT MAKE A THRID PASS TO REMOVE DEBRIS FROM BERYL.

Below are FEMA requirements all property owners must follow:

- ONLY DAMAGE FROM BERYL IS ELIGIBLE FOR REMOVAL. Broken tree limbs, down trees, broken fences, and damaged siding. THIS DOES NOT INCLUDE TREE TRIMMING OR PRUNING.
- Separate your trash bins/bags away from any vegetative or storm debris. Garbage cans, and bags will be serviced by regular scheduled garbage service. BAGGED leaves and branches are ineligible to be picked up
- Separate yard and vegetative waste from storm debris (such as fencing) and place in separate piles road side of ditch (NOT in the street).
- Please bundle small branches when possible. Large tree limbs do NOT need to be bundled. Vegetative waste will not be removed from private property, it must in the ROW. This may take more than one stack along roadside.
- Crews cannot enter private property, this includes private drives, RV parks and gated subdivisions
- Debris from unimproved land is ineligible.
