The anticipated new economy will bring back skilled labor that happens in a factory, a plant or on a farm or ranch. As the illegal immigrant population diminishes, the downward pressure on wages will be reduced and those whose skills, hard work and dedication demonstrate their merit will be able to work and live comfortable, fulfilling lives. It is time for young people to stop being told that college and its often associated enormous debt is the only answer. Learning vocations/trades and essential math, reading and science will be a reliable path to success.

Fathers need to return to teaching their sons about tools and problem solving and mothers need to do the same for their daughters. EPP encourages a broad variety of skills to be handed to the next generation before the current generation takes that knowledge to their graves.





# Cinnamon Bubble Bread

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### **Restaurant Review**

Pepe's on Fairmont in LaPorte was once called Las Hadas. The name changed a few years ago, but the food is the same. The real claim to fame is the fantastic salsa verde. It is not spicy and not guacamole based, but is loaded with onion and fantastic flavor. It is reason enough to go there. Their taco al carbon is more like a burrito, stuffed with diced beef or perhaps chicken and served with rice, beans, pico de gallo and guacamole. That one "taco" along with the inevitable gorging on the delicious green sauce will definitely fill up most diners. You do have to request the salsa verde or you will just get the fairly standard red sauce with your chips, which are thin but strong. EPP has been eating at this location under both names for years when in the area and it never fails to satisfy. Expect a tab of around \$20 per person for lunch.

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





Finally, I want to ask you to mark Saturday June 28 on your calendars. That is the date of our Lincoln Reagan dinner. Details will be forthcoming very soon
