
# They Are The Best!



# **Peach Cheese Tarts**

Prebaked tart shells 1-8 oz. pkg cream cheese 1 can condensed milk 1/3 cup lemon juice 1 teaspoon vanilla 3 - 4 fresh peaches 1/2 cup apricot preserves 2 Tablespoons sugar Whipped cream

Whip cheese, add condensed milk. Whip again. Stir in lemon juice and continue beating until thickened. Pour into the tart shells and chill. Slice peaches and place in shells. Melt preserves with sugar. When sugar is dissolved pour glaze over peaches. Top with whipped cream.

#### An ESD For San Leon?

Since the debacle with the San Leon Volunteer Fire Department and the termination of its mandatory fee agreement with the Municipal Utility District, some folks have been raising the idea of creating and Emergency Services District. EPP would like to share a bit of information on the subject and suggests interested parties do research on their own as well. First of all, this could not happen without county government and then voter approval. A new taxing entity would be created with a board that was initially appointed at the county level. That board, not the fire department, would control the funds raised. Now, about that funding, a ten cent per one hundred dollar tax on the value of property in the new taxing district would most likely be levied as that is the highest starting amount. Sales tax would increase on everything purchased in the district, to include utility bills and etc. The current \$10/month charge on the MUD bill could possibly reinstated to add to the total monies collected.

In other words, if the folks of San Leon wanted to increase their costs fairly substantially, the fire department could be awash in money. That money would remain under the financial control of the ESD board, though the day to day operations of the department would remain internal.

Other areas have gone this route with mixed results. Bacliff's department seems to do quite well financially with their monthly fee and substantial support from the community. They have no desire to be part of an ESD. Santa Fe has an ESD and there have been some growing pains to say the least, but they are also largely in an incorporated city. No matter what funding source a volunteer fire department uses, the department must be responsible with those funds and earn and keep the trust of the community it serves. EPP will continue to address this issue as the situation evolves.

A.J.'s Meat Market and Smokehouse on FM 517 in Dickinson is just barely a restaurant, but you can eat there. On a recent lunch day, EPP and a friend stopped in to give them a try. The place is old school meat market in its interior "design". Kind of dark and not super inviting. That said, the sliced beef, sausage and giant hamburger were pretty darn good. The pinto beans had a lot of meat and were flavorful. The potato salad was rather bland as it often is in big batches made for public consumption. The soft drink dispenser was not working, so it was water or iced tea for beverages.



The San Leon MUD has been operating under a Fire Suppression Contract with the San Leon Volunteer Fire Department for a number of years. The Contract calls for the MUD to collect a mandatory fee from its customers and pay the collected fees to the Fire Department to cover its expenses, to maintains its equipment, and to provide fire protection for the district's customers. In return, the Fire Department is to remain accountable for the use of the collected funds, in part by providing an annual audit to the MUD, which would be available for the public to examine. The Fire Department has failed to produce an audit for 2023, despite numerous requests from the MUD Board to do so. The last formal request required the Fire Department to produce the require audit no later than February 14, 2025, some 14 months after the audit was due. The Fire Department responded by asking for additional time to produce the audit, but the Board held to its deadline and elected to declare the Contract in default. The Board will now pursue all other avenues available to secure a new contract to provide fire protection services. In the interim, the fire department fee will be listed on customers' bills as "voluntary".

# They Came From **Around The County**

Bacliff VFD brings in outside professionals to provide hand on training around this time each year. It is considered so valuable that members from Bacliff, Dickinson, Kemah, League City, Galveston, Seabrook and San Leon fire departments make time in their schedules for this training. They learn or refresh on things like freeing a person impaled on a fence, removing a ring from a finger, lifting a vehicle off a trapped victim, handling and freeing a person who has been impaled in their vehicle and using powerful equipment to literally cut or rip apart an automobile to free a trapped or injured person.

With vehicles donated by the public to be destroyed in the process of learning and improving skills, hydraulic and now battery powered extrication tools are used by the beginners and old pros. Using a cordless dremel type tool to remove a ring from a finger safely is not something most will do often or ever, but it is a great skill set to have when needed. Even training on how to deal with a hand caught in a meat grinder is part of this all day program.
