February 8, 2026

Today's liturgy, through its readings, prepares us to understand what it means to be salt and light in our daily lives. Jesus uses everyday elements as examples to illustrate how we can add flavor to the Christian life. Bitterness, envy, and negative thoughts distance us from what truly matters: being simple and encountering God. "You are the salt of the earth. But if the salt loses its saltiness, how can it be made salty again? It is no longer good for anything, except to be thrown out and trampled underfoot" (Matthew 5:13). Adding flavor to life, by incorporating humility and openness to dialogue in the face of the adversities we experience in our families and in society, will be key to purifying and transforming our environment.

The Lord also calls us the light of the world: "Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead, they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house" (Matthew 5:14-15). When the power goes out in our homes, we are surprised, because sometimes we don't even have a candle to light, much less a battery-powered lamp. However, when we do light a light—no matter how small—we feel relief, because we can see where we are going and can carry out necessary tasks. Jesus wants his followers to be like this: like a pinch of salt and a little light, so that everything works differently in our families and in society.

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

Salt without flavor is no longer salt. Light that illuminates nothing is no longer light. As Christians, we must be what we have been made to be. So think about it, carefully: what stands between you and being who you were made to be?

Hoy la liturgia nos prepara, con su Palabra, a ser conscientes de lo que significa ser sal y luz en nuestra vida cotidiana. Jesús pone como ejemplo elementos que usamos todos los días para dar sabor a la vida del cristiano. La amargura, la envidia y la oscuridad de pensamientos nos alejan de lo que verdaderamente importa: ser sencillos y encontrarnos con Dios. "Ustedes son la sal de la tierra. Pero si la sal se vuelve insípida, ¿cómo podrá ser salada de nuevo? Ya no sirve para nada, por lo que se tira afuera y es pisoteada por la gente" (Mateo 5:13). Darle saborcito a la vida, añadiendo colores de humildad y apertura al diálogo frente a las adversidades que vivimos en la familia y en la sociedad, será clave para purificar y transformar nuestro entorno.

El Señor también nos llama luz del mundo: "Nadie enciende una lámpara para taparla con un cajón; la ponen más bien sobre un candelero, y alumbra a todos los que están en la casa" (Mateo 5:14-15). Cuando se va la luz en nuestra casa, nos sorprende, porque a veces no tenemos ni siquiera una vela que nos alumbré, mucho menos una lámpara con baterías. Sin embargo, al encender una luz—por muy pequeña que sea—sentimos alivio, porque podemos ver por dónde pisamos y así podemos realizar las actividades necesarias. Jesús quiere que sus seguidores sean así: como una pizca de sal y un poquito de luz, para que todo funcione de manera distinta en la familia y en la sociedad.

VIVIR LA LITURGIA - INSPIRACIÓN DE LA SEMANA

La sal sin sabor ya no es sal. La luz que no ilumina nada ya no es luz. Como cristianos, debemos ser lo que hemos sido hechos para ser. Así que piénsalo, cuidadosamente: ¿qué se interpone entre tú y ser quien fuiste hecho para ser?

OCIA Corner

Our parish has seven Catechumens who are preparing to enter the final stage of preparation to receive their Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Eucharist) at the Easter Vigil on April 4. This period is called Purification and Enlightenment and coincides with Lent, which begins with Ash Wednesday on Feb 18.

It is an intense time of prayer and reflection for them, as Lent is for all the baptized (you!) who will be preparing to renew their own baptismal promises.

Since their Initiation is the responsibility of the entire parish community, the OCIA team would like to ask you to raise your awareness as you accompany them in this last phase of their journey. Whether you attend the Mass at which the rites of this period are celebrated, or not, your own witness to the life of Christ and your prayers are essential.

If you can make an effort to reach out to them when you see them, or have a short conversation offering your support, we know they would respond with grateful hearts. 





As you know, the Michigan City parishes are in the process of merging into one parish. As part of this merger, the Queen of All Saints campus will serve as the anchor site, with the other locations designated as worship sites. While this terminology can sound a bit ambiguous, among other things, it means that parish operations will be centralized in one main office.

In light of this change, Brandi Hoffman, the secretary at Notre Dame, will be working three days a week at the Queen of All Saints campus. This change will take effect during the first week of February. As a result, the parish office at Notre Dame will be open only on Mondays.

If you need to conduct parish business on any day other than Monday, please visit the central parish office located at 606 S. Woodland Avenue on the Queen of All Saints campus. All phone calls—except on Mondays—will automatically be transferred to Brandi at the Queen of All Saints office, which will serve as the central office for our tri-parish community.


