## A letter from the Pastor

### Getting to Know One Another: “Name Tag Sunday”

As part of the merger of our three parish communities, many of us have noticed something new at Mass: unfamiliar faces sitting in familiar pews. Parishioners who once attended Mass at one campus are now worshiping regularly at another, and as a result, our churches are full of people we recognize—but may not yet know by name.

To help us grow more connected during this time of transition, the Notre Dame Pastoral Council has suggested a simple and friendly idea called “**Name Tag Sunday.**”

I know—just hearing the words *name tag* may make some of us a little uneasy. But the goal here is not to make anyone uncomfortable; it’s simply to help us feel more at home with one another and to build a stronger sense of community.

Here’s how “**Name Tag Sunday**” will work:

**When:** The first Sunday of each month

**What:** Parishioners will be invited (not required!) to wear a name tag at Mass and stay briefly afterward for a casual reception

**How:** Before Mass begins, we’ll invite everyone to offer a simple greeting to the people seated in front of and behind them

I understand that not everyone enjoys greeting others at Mass. Some prefer quiet and anonymity, and others worry that conversation in church might detract from the reverence of the liturgy. Those concerns are heard and respected. Participation is meant to be gentle and welcoming—not forced.

At the same time, we are reminded that the Church calls us the **Body of Christ**. While we come together first and foremost to worship God, we are also called to be a community—to share fraternity, care, and love for one another. Knowing someone’s name is a small but meaningful step toward that kind of unity.

There’s also a very practical benefit. Many of us have attended the same Mass for years—sometimes decades—sitting near the same people without ever learning their names. After a while, it can feel awkward to ask. “**Name Tag Sunday**” gives us an easy and gracious way to bridge that gap.

Even if we try this for just a couple of months, we can begin to learn names, welcome new parishioners more intentionally, and take an important step toward building a richer, more connected community of faith.

Thank you for your openness as we continue growing together.

#### **My Experience in Chapel at Morning Mass**

**Friday, January 5th, 2024**

I went up to receive the Eucharist from Father Dave. As I took the few steps toward Father, I reminded myself that this is Jesus that I am receiving. After Father placed the Eucharist in my left hand, I placed it on my tongue and walked a few feet back to the pew in our small chapel. I entered the pew and kneeled. I closed my eyes in preparation to swallow the Eucharist and to do a brief meditation. In that moment I entered another dimension although I did not know it until afterwards.

Jesus was there! Jesus was right next to me, almost brushing my right shoulder! I am aware of light. It is bright. I exclaim, “Oh Jesus you’re here! You’re so close!” Jesus was standing next to me. I kept repeating, Jesus you’re here! I was ecstatic. I wanted to jump for joy. I wanted to celebrate, I wanted to shout to everyone, “Look, Jesus is here!” It was a profound moment, a life-changing moment.

Jesus was wearing a long bright white garment, in a very fine fabric, like a vestment that a priest would wear. There was no embroidery or adornment of any kind, just a fold that flowed down the front. I didn’t see his face. I was kneeling and Jesus was standing on my right, turned toward me, so that I saw His long, white garment. I had not yet swallowed the Host, and I received a thought directing me to swallow. I seemed to be able to see the Host near the back of my mouth. It was not white and flat anymore. It was soft and thicker, the color of wheat bread. Jesus was standing next to me and the Eucharist was in my mouth, and in a telepathic way Jesus was telling me that He and the Eucharist are one and the same. He is the Eucharist. He is always present even if I can’t see him.

I have believed since my First Communion that the Host is Jesus and I always receive it with reverence. But I have not gone beyond knowing that in an unseen way Jesus is present. Now Jesus was making His Presence visible. As though He was telling me, “Look at me, I am real. I am here to show you that I am the Eucharist, at every Mass, in every corner of the world wherever the Mass is celebrated.

Then I heard Father say, “Please stand.” The Mass was ending. I stood and opened my eyes, disoriented for a few seconds. Jesus was gone. I was back in Chapel. I walked out and went into the church, sat down and relived those few precious life changing moments with Jesus. I continue to relive them every day.

I don’t know, I can’t explain why me. I know it is not because of any worthy-ness on my part. It is all about Jesus and his great love for all of us. It has taken me two years of meditating on my moments with Jesus, asking myself why me questions, to understand that Jesus allows us to participate in His Ministry. I have come to understand that he wants me to share those moments with Him so that more Catholics will believe in Jesus’ Real Presence in the Eucharist.

**February 22, 2026**

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent. The liturgical colors change, signifying a special time of conversion and repentance. Lent is a time to encounter Jesus in the desert, inviting us to conversion and reconciliation with all that separates us from God. It is also a time of profound spiritual renewal, prayer, fasting, and giving to those in need. This is important because it helps us arrive at the Easter of Jesus Christ's Resurrection with a pure and clean heart.

There will be many temptations that we must reject and overcome. This is achieved through a sincere approach to the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Let us remember that temptations are always seductive and deceptive. The Lord Jesus was tempted by the devil three times in the desert and emerged victorious. In the end, the Gospel tells us: "Then the devil left him, and angels came and attended him" (Matthew 4:11). Following in Jesus' footsteps is important during this Lenten season. How can we follow Him? you might ask. By trusting in His Word, praying as a family, as Pope Leo XIV asked us to do, and having an altar in our home, where we can see that God is the center of our lives. These small details lead us to Truth and Life, which is God Himself. Let us ask the Lord that His Word may penetrate the lukewarmness of our hearts this Lent, so that it may strengthen our weaknesses and not let us fall into temptation, as we say in the Lord's Prayer.

### LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

Our Lord is so humble that he allows us to see him experience temptation. The vulnerability of this moment is awesome to behold. Let us learn from Jesus' interaction with the devil, and be transformed by it. Let us say, with him: "Get away, Satan."

**22 de febrero de 2026**

*Con el Miércoles de Ceniza inicia el Tiempo de Cuaresma. Los colores litúrgicos cambian, indicando un tiempo especial de conversión y arrepentimiento. *Habrà muchas tentaciones que debemos rechazar y vencer. Esto se logra con un acercamiento sincero al Sacramento de la Reconciliación. Recordemos que las tentaciones son siempre seductoras y engañosas. El Señor Jesús fue tentado por el diablo tres veces en el desierto y salió victorioso. Al final, nos relata el Evangelio: "Entonces lo dejó el diablo y se acercaron los ángeles a servirle" (Mateo 4:11). Seguir los pasos de Jesús es importante en este Tiempo de Cuaresma. ¿Cómo seguirlo?, quizá se pregunte. Confianza en su Palabra, rezando en familia, como nos lo pide el Papa León XIV, y teniendo un altar en casa, donde se pueda apreciar que Dios es el centro de nuestra vida. Estos pequeños detalles nos conducen a la Verdad y a la Vida, que es Dios mismo. Pidamos al Señor que su Palabra penetre en la tibieza de nuestro corazón en esta Cuaresma, para que dé fortaleza a nuestras debilidades y no nos deje caer en la tentación, como decimos en el Padrenuestro.*

### VIVIR LA LITURGIA - INSPIRACIÓN DE LA SEMANA

## Who should receive the Anointing of the Sick?

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not for everyone, nor is it only for those who are at the point of death; therefore, if you have begun “to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived” (Second Vatican Council, *Sacrosanctum Concilium*, no. 73). This includes any sick persons who are preparing for surgery (cf. *Order of the Anointing of the Sick*, no. 10). If you have been anointed in the past, there is no need to repeat the Sacrament, unless your condition has notably worsened, or if you have recovered and become sick again (cf. *Code of Canon Law*, 1004, §2).

This Sacrament is intended to be received in conjunction with sacramental confession; the Anointing of the Sick does not impart the absolution of sins, unless you are otherwise unable to go to confession (cf. *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, no. 1532).

The Sacrament will be offered during Masses on the weekend of **March 7 & 8**. Those who meet these conditions and wish to receive the Anointing are asked to **contact the parish office in advance so we may prepare appropriately**. Please call **219-872-9196** to submit your name and indicate which day and time you will be attending.

## ¿Quién debe recibir la Unción de los enfermos?

*El sacramento de la Unción de los enfermos no es para cualquier persona, ni es sólo para aquellos que están a punto de morir; por eso, “el tiempo oportuno para recibirlo comienza cuando el cristiano ya empieza a estar en peligro de muerte por enfermedad o vejez” (Concilio Vaticano II, Sacrosanctum concilium, n. 73). Esto incluye a cualquier enfermo que se esté preparando para una intervención quirúrgica (cf. Orden de la Unción de los enfermos, n. 10).*

*Si has sido ungido en el pasado, no es necesario repetir el Sacramento, a menos que haya un agravamiento de la enfermedad, o si te has recuperado y te encuentras nuevamente en una enfermedad grave (cf. Código de derecho canónico, 1004, §2).*

*Este sacramento debe recibirse, si es posible, junto con la confesión sacramental; la Unción de los enfermos no imparte la absolución de los pecados, a menos que por otras razones no te puedas confesar (cf. Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, n. 1532). El sacramento se ofrecerá durante las misas del fin de semana del 7 y 8 de marzo. Aquellos que cumplan estas condiciones y deseen recibir la unción deben ponerse en contacto con la oficina parroquial con antelación para que podamos prepararnos adecuadamente. Por favor, llame al 219-872-9196 para dar su nombre e indicar el día y la hora a la que asistirá.*

## OCLA Corner


Today we celebrated the Rite of Sending with our Catechumens, assuring them of our parish's care and support as they make their way to the Cathedral this afternoon for the Rite of Election.

### What happens at the Rite of Election?

The Rite of Election is a diocesan-wide celebration, affirming our catechumens being elected (chosen) by God during a Liturgy of the Word at the diocesan cathedral. After the homily, the catechumens are presented to the bishop individually, speaking their names. Once they are called, the bishop questions the godparents and the assembly as to their readiness to be admitted to the Sacraments of Initiation. The bishop declares the catechumens as members of the Elect, a name change that signifies a change in identity for them. Intercessions will be offered and the bishop will offer a special prayer over them to conclude the rite. They will have an opportunity at a reception to meet Bishop McClory as he signs our parish's Book of the Elect.




