The Kingdom of God is built in everyday life, where each of us is the protagonist. We must work hard and perfection is demanded; however, at the same time, we are asked not to pretend, not to boast, but, on the contrary, to be humble and serve those in need. Because your Kingdom, Lord, is built with dedication, effort, and love. It is not about prestige or comfort. "We should not seek the attention and consideration of others on our own initiative, but rather allow others to give it to us. Jesus always shows us the path of humility. We must learn the path of humility! Because it is the most authentic, which also allows us to have authentic relationships" (Pope Francis).

The first seats at feasts should be taken with humility, not with prominence. This Sunday, Jesus gives us a lesson in what humility is at the banquets or parties to which we are invited. "When someone invites you to a wedding feast, do not choose the best place. Perhaps someone more distinguished than you has been invited, and the one who invited you both may come and say to you, 'Give your place to this person.' And you will be put to shame and take the lowest place" (Luke 14:8-9). All of us who serve the Lord must take our place in the service we perform, whether in the family, at work, or in the community. Serving always involves taking the lowest place.

Todos los servidores del Señor debemos ocupar su lugar en el servicio que realizamos, ya sea en la familia, en el trabajo o en la comunidad. Servir implica siempre ocupar el último lugar.



Our pantry and our clients are so grateful to CCH for its work and its weekly sharing of important and much needed foods. Thank you CCH




