A letter from the Pastor

Mary, Mother of Mercy

In the coming weeks, the Diocesan Priest Council will meet to consider a resolution that would unite Notre Dame Parish with Queen of All Saints Parish as one parish. You may recall that St. Mary and Queen of All Saints have already been joined as a single parish. If this resolution is approved and formally declared, Queen of All Saints, St. Mary, and Notre Dame will officially become one parish, made up of three distinct campuses. At that time, the newly united parish will receive a new name. After consultation with many individuals and groups over the past several years, there has been clear and consistent affirmation of a name that reflects our tri-campus reality. The parish formed by the union of these three communities will be called **Mary, Mother of Mercy**.

When the parishes of Queen of All Saints, St. Mary, and Notre Dame are definitively united, this new name will apply to the parish as a whole. Each church will continue to honor and retain its historical name, but its designation will shift from "parish" to "campus." In other words, we will have one parish with three campuses. St. Mary Parish will become St. Mary Campus, Queen of All Saints Parish will become Queen of All Saints Campus, and Notre Dame Parish will become Notre Dame Campus. Together, these three campuses will form the single parish of Mary, Mother of Mercy.

I truly love this name for our tri-campus parish. It is both beautiful and fitting. Each of our churches already honors Our Blessed Mother: Queen of All Saints, St. Mary, and Notre Dame. It feels right and natural that our shared parish identity would continue to place Mary at the heart of who we are.

Beyond this continuity, there is also a deeply theological reason for choosing this name. We are living in a time when the world is in great need of God's mercy—perhaps more than ever. As Catholics, we know that we seek this mercy through Jesus Christ, and we trust that Mary, His Mother, always leads us to Him. Mary is rightly called the Mother of Mercy because she is the Mother of Jesus, who is the living image of the Father's mercy. Standing beneath the Cross, Mary was uniquely united to her Son's sacrifice, interceding for the mercy that flows from His saving death.

As our Mother, Mary continues to plead for mercy for all her children before the throne of God. In choosing this name, we place our parish under her loving care and ask her to guide us, protect us, and intercede for us in these challenging times.

Mary, Mother of Mercy, pray for us. Amen.

March 1, 2026

Today's liturgy is filled with symbols of glory and majesty. If we pay attention, we can discover God's great love for his Son Jesus and also for us, manifested in his Transfiguration. Future glory is presented in the cloud as a sign of God's presence, as well as in the white garments and the face of Jesus, radiant like the sun. "Before their very eyes, his appearance changed completely: his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became as white as light" (Matthew 17:2). The death that Jesus had previously announced to his disciples, the death he was about to suffer, will be transformed into glory at Easter. However, to reach that Easter, we must travel the road to Calvary, toward the cross. Peter suggested building three shelters; he was so comfortable there, with his companions and with Jesus. Suddenly, the voice of the Father is heard saying: "This is my beloved Son; this is my Chosen One, listen to him!" (Matthew 17:5).

To be true followers of Jesus, we must detach ourselves from our comforts and whims. Lent, which has just begun, should lead us to commit ourselves to the common good and to the justice that society so desperately needs today. The harsh reality we are experiencing should also be a path to finding the light and the voice of God, who calls us to awaken and act in response to the needs of others. The question also arises: whom are we listening to? To whom, or to what, are we paying attention? Let us remember that following the Master demands effort and dedication. Let us, then, come down from the mountaintop to walk with Jesus this Lent.

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

"Go forth," God told Abram. We hear that message again in the Transformation: go forth. We cannot always remain where we are comfortable. We cannot always remain where things are simple. We must go forth.

La liturgia de hoy está llena de símbolos de gloria y majestad. Si estamos atentos, podremos descubrir el gran amor de Dios hacia su Hijo Jesús y también hacia nosotros, manifestado en su Transfiguración. La gloria futura se presenta en la nube como signo de la presencia de Dios, así como en los vestidos blancos y el rostro de Jesús resplandeciente como el sol. "A la vista de ellos, su aspecto cambió completamente: su cara brillaba como el sol y su ropa se volvió blanca como la luz" (Mateo 17:2). La muerte que Jesús había anunciado previamente a sus discípulos, la que iba a padecer, será transformada en gloria en la Pascua. Sin embargo, para llegar a esa Pascua hay que pasar por el camino del Calvario, hacia la cruz. Pedro propuso hacer tres tiendas; estaba tan bien allí, con sus compañeros y con Jesús. De repente, se escucha la voz del Padre que dice: "Este es mi Hijo, el Amado; éste es mi Elegido, ¡escúchenlo!" (Mateo 17:5).

Para ser verdaderos seguidores de Jesús, debemos desinstalarnos de nuestras comodidades y de nuestros caprichos. La Cuaresma, que apenas comienza, debe llevarnos a comprometernos con el bien común y con la justicia que tanto necesita la sociedad actual. La dura realidad que estamos viviendo debe ser también un camino para encontrar la luz y la voz de Dios que nos llama a despertar y actuar frente a las necesidades de los demás. También cabe la pregunta: ¿a quién estamos escuchando? ¿A quién, o a qué, le estamos haciendo caso? Recordemos que seguir al Maestro exige esfuerzo y entrega. Bajemos, pues, de lo alto del monte para caminar con Jesús en esta Cuaresma.




