GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Today's feast is set apart to reverence the gift of Jesus in the Eucharist. In our limited human capacity, this concept can feel abstract, and we may struggle to understand it. In these moments, I find that pondering the person of Jesus Christ in the Gospels illuminates my mind and heart. Hearing the familiar story of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes in today's Gospel, I'm particularly struck by the first line of the passage: "Jesus spoke to the crowds about the kingdom of God, and he healed those who needed to be cured." Notice that Luke doesn't say that Jesus heals everyone, rather, he heals those who need to be cured. This is not an act of favoritism, but a revelation of his perfect divine wisdom and a glimpse into the true person of Jesus Christ. In his great mercy and perfect love, Jesus knew instantly what each person needed. And this Jesus, who came to heal and cure, is the one we receive in the Eucharist today.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Today's feast is a reminder of the staggering truth that 2,000 years later, at every Eucharistic celebration in Catholic churches around the world, Christ becomes truly present. The same Jesus of the Gospels who taught the crowds, multiplied the loaves, and gave himself completely on the cross, gives himself to us *today:* body, blood, soul, and divinity. We are not unlike the crowds in today's Gospel — we have come with our hopes and needs to encounter Jesus. Today, at this table, no one goes hungry; Jesus meets our needs by giving us his unconditional love while nourishing us both physically and spiritually. We can be reassured that God is always present in our lives.

REFLECT

In a special way today, reflect on the Eucharist, the "source and summit of the Christian life." The word Eucharist comes from Greek and Latin words for "thanksgiving." Pray with a grateful heart today that Jesus, the Bread of Life, makes himself truly present to us.

"I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me shall not hunger, and whoever believes in me shall never thirst." (Jn 6:35)

A Message from Father Kime

Weekday Mass Schedule Update: Summer & Beyond

As you may know, beginning in July, I will be named pastor of Notre Dame Parish, in addition to my ongoing responsibilities at Queen of All Saints and St. Mary. With our three priests now serving across three distinct campuses, it has become necessary to adjust our weekday Mass schedule. Since each of us takes one day off per week and carries many other pastoral duties—such as funerals, weddings, and special liturgies—these changes are intended to reflect the practical realities of parish life, the spiritual needs of the laity, the well-being of the clergy, and the guidance of Canon Law.*

With this in mind—and with a spirit of fairness and sustainability—we will implement a temporary weekday Mass schedule for the months of July and August, followed by a new weekday schedule in September for the academic year. All three campuses will be affected. I have done my best to minimize disruption and to ensure that each community remains spiritually nourished. I can say sincerely that I have spent many hours in prayer, reflection, and consultation regarding this schedule. While each campus will make some sacrifices, the goal is to balance the needs of our parishioners, our presence in the community, and the well-being of the clergy who serve you.

I know that change is rarely easy. If it were within my power, I would leave most things just as they are. But Jesus leads His Church along paths we might not choose ourselves, and our call is to follow with trust and prudence. These adjustments are part of our response to the road ahead.

Below is the temporary weekday schedule for July and August, followed by the new school-year weekday Mass schedule, which will begin in September and continue through the 2025–2026 academic year. Although the Sunday Mass schedule will eventually need to be re-evaluated, this current adjustment affects **only** weekday Masses. For now, the Sunday schedule will remain unchanged – except of course, that Notre Dame will return to their normal / non-summer mass time as soon as Queen of All Saints reopens at the end of the summer. (A huge thanks to Notre Dame and St. Mary for hosting the Queen of All Saints Masses.)

Temporary Weekday Mass Schedule (July & August): Monday through Friday: Queen of All Saints – 7:30 AM• Monday through Friday: Notre Dame – 8:30 AM• Saturday: St. Mary – 8:30 AM• Sunday Mass schedule remains unchanged• Spanish weekday evening Masses suspended during July and August

New Weekday School-Year Mass Schedule (Beginning September 2025): Monday & Wednesday: 8:30 AM at Notre Dame (with schoolchildren) Tuesday & Thursday: 8:30 AM at Queen of All Saints (with schoolchildren) Monday through Friday: 7:30 AM at St. Mary Saturday: 8:30 AM at St. Mary Friday: Spanish Mass – 5:00 PM at Queen of All Saints Sunday Mass schedule will remain unchanged for the immediate future; except for an end of summer schedule at Notre Dame

I am sincerely grateful for your patience, understanding, and flexibility during this time of transition. Let us continue to walk together in faith, trusting that the Lord will guide—and provide for—us every step of the way.
