## Notes in Italics

- 1. Welcome
  - a. Updates from 2023
    - i. Pool
      - 1. Total cost near \$70,000 (*Pro Pool- we were not impressed with their work*)
      - 2. Switch pool companies to Unique, contract around \$55,000 (saving about \$15,000)
      - 3. Had sewer lines under and around pool professionally scoped in Jan. 2024; results were positive, no reason to be concerned in short term (@ \$250 spent)
    - ii. Leaf Removal Fall 2023
      - 1. Largely welcomed by residents
      - 2. Cost about \$14,000 (budgeted about \$10k we have lots of leaves!)
      - 3. Residents surveyed like the leaf removal, not the cost
      - 4. Look at options next Fall (fewer pickups, timed differently, etc)
      - Get some different bids next year
    - *iii.* Tree Replacement Program
      - 1. Still going strong, but demand has slightly decreased
      - 2. Budgeted \$15,000
      - 3. Thanks to Jason Gutleber who runs this program
      - 4. Email <u>timberwoodtrails@gmail.com</u> to get your trees replaced
    - iv. Social Committee
      - 1. \$5,000
      - 2. This is for all social events in the neighborhood (egg hunt, 4th of July, pool parties, welcome committee, etc)
      - 3. Steve Smith will request the check to be sent to the social committee through CIty and Village
      - 4. Events (Memorial Day Weekend Opening day a the pool, barb-q, July 4 AM parade and popsicles at the pool, 2 movie nights, Luau, Fall Festival, etc). Thank you social committee
    - v. Street signs
      - 1. Expensive to replace due to type of pole consistently used throughout neighborhood
      - 2. Runs about \$2500-3000 to entirely replace a pole
      - 3. Mason Ridge and Summer Ridge, Stone's Signs replaces thesereport issues to <u>timberwoodtrails@gmail.com</u>
- 2. HOA Fees

- a. Remain at \$400 annually- After tonight's budget meeting Steve has a form that gets notarized, goes to City and Village and then there is a 30 day window to send things out
- b. Assessments will go out early March, will be due mid April
- c. Residents will need to be paid in full prior to picking up pool bands
- 3. 2024 Budget Priorities
  - a. Pool Contract
    - *i.* Electronic Check-In at pool Idea from pool company to give away fobs to families as it tracks who comes in and out electronically. We would probably still have a sign in for guests if we use this new system
  - b. Leaf Removal see above
  - c. Entrance signs- waiting on one more bid to come in, once the bid is chosen, we will have a survey done for the property lines, and start moving through the process
  - d. Flock Cameras at entrances all St. Charles Co Parks have these and so do our neighbors in Brittany Place. They capture pictures of license plates on cars who are exiting or entering the neighborhood.
    - i. Example: If we have a lot of break ins in the neighborhood we can share the footage with the police and they can check license plates of cars
  - e. Retention Basin upkeep *Ridgefield Mike has the history and background of all of this off Ridgefield -a long time there is a retention basin that the neighbors requested to be plugged so they have what looks like a pond.*
- 4. Wrap-Up/Close Anyone else have anything? No questions...
