#### "The Divided Methodist Church: The Road Ahead"

"We can make our plans, but the LORD determines our steps."

Proverbs 16:9, NLT

It's been said more than once that "The Texas Panhandle is so flat, that if your dog ran away, you could stand on the porch and watch him run to the next town." Around here, people are used to driving on interstates and highways where the lack of landscape lets them see what lies ahead for the next two to three miles. If you're a native West Texan like me, then you also probably take for granted the ability to "look ahead" and see every step of your journey with clarity. Unfortunately, not everything in life has a clear view like the Panhandle of West Texas.

THE REARVIEW MIRROR - Since 1968, The United Methodist Church has been a three-lane interstate where United Methodists who lean to the left, to the right, or down the middle, could all drive side-by-side. Each lane has its own understanding of the Wesleyan way to allow Scripture, reason, tradition, and experience to guide them in discipleship and ministry. Yet the congregations and clergy in all three lanes agreed to drive by the "rules of the road" laid out in the Book of Discipline. However, infighting and blatant disregard of the Book of Discipline by multiple UMC congregations and clergy caused a rift within the denomination on hot-button issues like human sexuality, to the core beliefs like the resurrection of Jesus. In May 2019, at The General Conference of the UMC, these differences regarding our understanding and interpretation of Scripture, our theology, and our practice, caused delegates to reach an impasse at the meeting, with no clear way forward for the denomination. Then, a worldwide pandemic happened, and the international and domestic travel restrictions put in place by governments caused the regularly scheduled 2020 General Conference to be postponed -not once, but twice. In other words, the gridlock brought the UMC three-lane interstate to a standstill, with people in both the left lane and right lane trying to find an exit.

THE ROAD WE'RE ON — Simply put, the time has come for the three-lane interstate to become a junction. After the General Conference in 2019, key leaders from each of the factions within the denomination met to try and find a way forward, as well as a way out for those who desired to leave the UMC. Together, they composed "The Protocol of Reconciliation and Grace through Separation," which outlines how the denomination will divide into three (or more) denominations: (1) a new left wing progressive denomination, (2) the post-separation United Methodist denomination, and (3) a new right wing traditional denomination. "The Protocol" will be presented to the General Conference delegates at their next session, currently scheduled for August 29 — September 06, 2022 in Minneapolis, Minnesota.

THE EXIT AHEAD – At the 2021 Northwest Texas Annual Conference, our delegates were presented with details and information on the topic of separation by the NWTX Transition Team. On Saturday, August 14th, during the final business session, our NWTX Conference delegates discussed and passed a resolution with three primary directives:

- (1) the NWTX Conference endorsed The Protocol, and urges the General Conference to adopt it substantially unchanged;
- (2) the NWTX Conference declared its intention to align with a new, to-be formed traditional Methodist denomination;
- (3) the NWTX Conference called upon all its members to treat one another with respect and love during this process. The Resolution wasn't a vote for separation, but a statement on the direction that NWTX Conference will be taking. It'll be at least one more year before *The Protocol* is acted on, but once that happens, it will layout all the steps for the NWTX Annual Conference to join the Global Methodist Church – a new, traditional denomination pending formation.

Once the NWTX Conference votes on separation, **FUMC Stanton will have to decide** whether it will also exit with the Conference, or remain a part of the post-separation United Methodist Church. In the meantime, I ask that you continue to pray fervently and reverently for our delegates, our NWTX Conference, and the United Methodist Church!


