TALLAHASSEE --- The federal government is increasingly inserting itself into the fight over whether Florida public-school students should be required to wear masks, and top state education officials further escalated a feud with the feds this week. The State Board of Education on Thursday backed a recommendation by Education Commissioner Richard Corcoran to financially penalize school boards in eight counties that have maintained student mask mandates to try to prevent the spread of COVID-19. An announcement from DeSantis' office on Monday sent shockwaves through the Florida political world, as it

disclosed that First Lady Casey DeSantis is battling breast cancer. The governor issued a statement about the diagnosis, though the statement did not provide details about issuessuch as the type of breast cancer, the stage or treatment. 





Dear Fellow ABATE Members,

Road Rage Victim or Perpetrator?

Several months ago, while we were over in the Miami area, a cager attempted to run someone down on his scoot! The same day (and/ or close to it), a driver was shooting at another driver due to an accidental cut-off incident. Road rage incidents seem to be increasing, as society seems to be becoming more polarized and frustrated with politics, personal issues, along with the ongoing pandemic, etc...

Because we are physically more vulnerable while on a motorcycle, being the victim or perpetrator of road rage could easily turn out to be fatal and/or permanently life altering. It could happen to you and/or your passenger.

We deal with a lot of things on the road easily causing our indignation:

- -Texting/cell phones Many times they cause impediment of traffic by driving too slow, not moving when the light turns green, weaving in and out of their lane, etc...
- -Aggressive drivers Weaving in and out of lanes at high speeds, sometimes "racing" another driver doing the same things, etc...
- -Heavy traffic that causes everyone aggravation...

Before riding, check any issues bothering you. Many times, the things that may cause one to explode, have been building up inside for a period of time and it only takes one little spark/incident to cause ignition!

When you are caught in a situation, follow the scripture in James 1:19-20, "Understand this, my beloved brothers and sisters.

Let everyone be quick to hear [be a careful, thoughtful listener], slow to speak [a speaker of carefully chosen words and], slow to anger [patient, reflective, forgiving]; for the [resentful, deep-seated] anger of man does not produce the righteousness

of God [that standard of behavior which He requires from us]" (AMP)

Ecclesiastes 7:9 says, "Do not be quick in spirit to be angry or vexed, for anger and vexation lodge in the bosom of fools." (AMPC)

Put this into your heart and always remember, "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control. Against such there is no law." Galatians 5:22-23 (NKJV)

A prayer of salvation AND protection... Please pray, "Dear God, the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, my heavenly Father, the God of Jesus, I confess that I am a sinner and have been separated from You. I ask forgiveness of my sins. 
