## The Georgian Hills Neighborhood Watch Program is being reestablished.

The purpose of our program is to enhance safety and sense of community within Georgian Hills by organizing and involving individuals and families in a united crime prevention effort. Al Hoke and Jay Jordan will serve as the program's points of contact.

### Facts about the Georgian Hills Neighborhood Watch Program:

- The Georgian Hills Neighborhood Watch Program is not guard or patrol duties. It is getting to know your neighbors, focusing on community issues, forming action groups and finding resolutions to neighborhood problems. It's a partnership between the Gwinnett County Police Department and our community.
- "Suspicious persons" calls are easier to investigate than actual crimes. Neighborhood Watch areas often generate more suspicious persons calls to the police but often experience lower levels of crime.

### **Neighbor Responsibilities:**

- Be aware. Report any unusual or suspicious behavior to the police and then your block/cluster captain. Write down descriptions of the person(s) and license number of any vehicles.
- Keep a trusted neighbor informed if your house will be unoccupied for an extended period. It is important to leave that neighbor a way of reaching you if an emergency should arise.
- Look after your neighbor's house when they are away and ask them to look after yours.
- Make it a point to meet the neighbors that touch your property line (the homes on each side, two homes across from you and one in the back of you (if applicable)).
- REMEMBER -- Your job is to report crime. The responsibility for confronting and apprehending criminals belongs to the police.

### **Block/Cluster Captain Responsibilities:**

- Introduce yourself to the neighbors on your block/cluster.
- Share information for own block/cluster directory, current names, addresses, phone numbers, etc.
- Keep a contact list of at least one person living in each house in your cluster: name and contact number (in case of emergencies).
- Attend general neighborhood meetings.
- Report to the neighborhood association Board any block information needing attention by the association.
- Hold periodic block/cluster meetings to discuss issues relating to your area of the neighborhood.
- Welcome new neighbors on your block/cluster.
- Identify a willing individual to take your place when your term as block/cluster captain is over.

We will schedule follow-up meetings for the block/cluster captains. A neighborhood wide meeting will also be scheduled.
