Qualifications for Holding Office

There are THREE qualifications:

- 18 Years Old
- United States Citizen
- Resident of the Village (BY THE DATE OF THE ELECTION - March 21, 2023)



Important Dates for Filing Petitions & Nominations (Party and Independent)

PARTY NOMINATIONS

01/24/2023 - Earliest date for holding a party caucus.

01/26/2023 - 1st day to file certificate of party nomination.

01/31/2022 - Last date for holding a party caucus.

02/02/2023 - Last day to file certificate of party nomination.

02/06/2023 - Last day to file certificate of acceptance or declination.

02/08/2023 - Last day to fill vacancy due to declination.

INDEPENDENT PETITION

01/03/2023 - 1st day to sign Independent petition.

02/01/2023 - 1st day to file Independent petition.

02/08/2023 - Last day to file independent petition (100 signatures required).

02/11/2023 - Last day to file certificate of acceptance or declination.

02/14/2023 - Last day to fill vacancy due to declination.



Three Ways Candidate Can Get On the Ballot:

- 1. Nominated By Political Party at a Caucus
- 2. Nominated By Independent Body by Petition or
- 3. Appointed by committee to fill vacancy



Party Configurations

- "Any political organization that in last Gubernatorial Election received at least 130,000 Votes or 2% of Total Votes Cast (Whichever is Greater).
- Four party lines in Port Chester: Democrat,
 Republican, Conservative, Working Families



Caucus Dates

- 1/24/2023 Earliest date for holding party caucus; (56 days)
- 1/31/2023 Last date for party caucus (49 days)

*NOTE: Village Does NOT Pay For the Costs of the Party Caucuses

*NOTE: Party Rules and Procedures Control whether to have a caucus



Party Caucus

- WHAT: Meeting of political party members who are Village residents at which candidates are nominated for Village Office, meetings are not open to the public, only said party members can participate.
- WHO PARTICIPATES: Any village resident that is enrolled member of party
- WHEN: 56-49 Days Before Election



Notice Requirements

- Party must post & file a notice of the caucus with the Village Clerk and County Board of Elections at least 10 days prior to the caucus.
- Notice must also be published at least once in a "newspaper of general circulation" at least one week, but not more than two weeks before the caucus.
- Alternative to publishing notice of the caucus in a newspaper, party may post notice of caucus in 6 public places in the Village at least 10 days before the day of the caucus.
- Notice must specify the time, place and purpose of the caucus including the offices for which candidates will be nominated.



What happens at a Caucus?

- Only residents of the Village who are enrolled members of the party may participate in the caucus.
- Caucus Can Nominate Non-party Members
- Procedure usually follows Roberts Rules of Order
- Candidate Nominations, Seconds, Speeches and Votes
- After Caucus Party Must File Certificate of Nomination
- Candidate must accept nomination and file
 Certificate of Acceptance
 Port Chester

The Nomination Process: Independent Nominations

To run for office on a line other than an official party line, one must file an **independent nominating petition**. The New York State Election Law sets forth the form of this petition; § 15-108 (village elections).

Any registered voter who has not already signed a designating petition, and who is qualified to vote for an office, may sign an independent nominating petition for that office. For Village offices, if you participated in a caucus, you cannot sign an independent nominating petition.



Independent Nominations

Independent Party Name & Emblem

All Independent Petitions Must Have Name and Emblem - (name must be in English, and must not include the name, part of the name, or abbreviation of any existing political party.)

CANNOT USE:

Any Party Name

Portrait of Any Person

Religious Emblem/Insignia

Coin/Currency

Flag

The Words American, United States, National, New York State, Empire State



The Nomination Process: Independent Nominations

Independent Party Name & Emblem

Proper to Use

Animals & Anchor & Any Other Proper Symbol

What if Candidate Does Not Select Name or Emblem?

 Westchester County Board of Election Then Chooses One If Candidate Will Not

What if Two Petitions Are Filed With Similar Name/Emblem?

 The petition filed **first** is allowed to use the selected name and emblem, while the other petitioners must select other names or emblems.

Number of Signatures Required in Port Chester

POPULATION	5000+
Minimum Number of Signatures	100



Filing Petitions

What Must be Filed by <u>MIDNIGHT</u> on Last Day to File or

Postmarked by Midnight on Last Day to File

ALL PAPERS – Election Law § 1-106

- ⇒ Certificates of Party Designation
- ⇒Independent Nominating Petitions

If Mailed

All POSTMARKED Papers MUST BE RECEIVED Not Later than 2 BUSINESS DAYS

After Last Day to File (Chapter 5 of the Laws of 2019)



Important Notes on Filing Petitions

 Petitions Over 10 Pages Must Have Cover Sheet

 Candidate's name is listed on ballot as it is listed on the Certificate of Acceptance, names that contain more than 15 letters may be listed in an abbreviated form.



Accepting/Declining Village Nominations

Westchester County Board of Election

Must Notify Nominees That They Must File Certificate of

Acceptance in The County Board of Election Office

Party Caucus Nomination:

- Must file a certificate of party nomination no later than 47 days prior to the village election.
- Must file a certificate of acceptance or declination no later than
 44 days prior to the election

Declination = Committee to fill vacancies

Independent Petition Nomination:

MUST File Within 3 Days of Last Day to File Petition

Failure to File = DECLINE



Important Dates for Filing Challenges to Party Nomination & Independent Petition

CHALLENGES TO PARTY NOMINATIONS

- 02/03/2023 Last day to file written objections to certificates of party nomination
- 02/06/2023 Last day to file written specifications of objections to certificates of party nomination

CHALLENGES TO INDEPENDENT PETITION

- 02/15/2023 Last day to file written objections to independent nominating petitions
- 02/17/2023 Last day to file written specifications of objections to independent nominating petitions



Challenges to Nomination

- Challenger must file <u>WRITTEN</u> objection with the no later than one
 (1) day after the last date to file the petition with the Westchester
 County Board of Election
- MUST file written specifications to objections within 2 days of filing objection

Failure to File specifications to objections = Objection Tossed Out

- County Board of Elections Renders it's Decision and Notifies Interested Parties
- Challenger, if not satisfied with decision, can file with court.



Financial Filings

- 2/17/2023 Deadline for filing the first statement of campaign receipts and expenditures for the Village Election.
- 3/10/2023 Deadline for filing the second statement of campaign receipts and expenditures for the Village Election.
- 4/17/2023 Deadline for filing the third statement campaign receipts and expenditures for the Village Election.

Required Forms

The following are the New York State Board of Elections legal forms that are required to be filed with the Westchester County Board of Election.

These forms must be filed in English:

- Certificate of Nomination
- Certificate of Acceptance
- Independent Petition
- Cover Sheet for Independent Petition
- Campaign Financial Disclosure Form
- Committee Registration/Treasurer and Bank Information
- Committee Authorization Status
- Candidate's Authorization For A Committee to Make Financial Disclosures
