

### Conard House Celebrates Black History Month 2023



Have you ever wondered why Americans celebrate Black History Month in February? It all began in 1915 with Dr. Carter G. Woodson (Pruitt, 2023), an African American, Harvard-trained historian, 50 years after the 13th Amendment to the Constitution was ratified abolishing slavery in the United States.

Woodson along with minister Jesse E. Moorland founded the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History (ASNLH), an organization dedicated to researching and promoting achievements by African Americans and other peoples of African descent.

In 1926 the ASNLH, now known as the Association for the Study of African American Life and History (ASALH), sponsored the first national Black History Week choosing the second week of February because it coincided with the birthdays of Abraham Lincoln and Fredrick Douglass. What followed well into the 1960s was schools, communities and mayors of cities throughout the nation recognizing Black History Week. American Presidents over the following decades have issued proc-

lamations recognizing what was then called "Negro History Week."

Due in part to the civil rights movement in the late 1960s this national week of recognition evolved into Black History Month. President Gerald Ford officially recognized February Black History Month in 1976 stating, "we need to "seize the opportunity to honor the too-often neglected accomplishments of black Americans in every area of endeavor throughout our history."

More recently in a proclamation delivered by President Joseph R. Biden, Jr. (House, 2022), he said, "Each February, National Black History Month serves as both a celebration and a powerful reminder that Black history is American history, Black culture is American culture, and Black stories are essential to the ongoing story of America — our faults, our struggles, our progress, and our aspirations."

Each year since 1976 every United States President has not only designated February as Black History Month but has also endorsed a specific Angie Brown-Tanielian, Director of Development

theme. This year's theme, "Black Resistance," (BLACK HISTORY THEMES – ASALH – the Founders of Black History Month, n.d.) explores how African Americans have addressed historic and ongoing disadvantage and oppression.

In a statement issued by San Francisco Mayor London Breed (*Mayor London Breed on Black History Month I San Francisco*, n.d.) on February 1, 2023, she stated, "Our City is no stranger to the powerful influence of Black leaders and their lasting impacts. With this year's theme of Black Resistance, we must remember to honor those who tirelessly fought for the very freedoms we have today and use the strength of their spirit to recommit ourselves to resisting injustices that keep us from moving forward."




