# Introduction

The Book of Numbers in the Bible is a historical account of God's dealings with His people, Israel, during their journey to the Promised Land. Numbers 28, in particular, holds significant spiritual gems that edify the followers of Yeshua HaMashiach to this day. It details with God's specific instructions about offerings and sacrifices during various celebrations, feasts, and daily

rituals. Though seeming repetitious and meticulous to some, the spiritual truths buried within this chapter are rich and profound.

# **Daily Offerings**

## **Numbers 28:1-8**

- 1. Elohim commanded the Israelites to offer two lambs everyday...one in the morning and one in the evening. (Exodus 29:38-42).
- 2. This commandment reiterates the importance of an ongoing relationship with the Father.
- 3. It signifies how our devotion and worship should be a continuous day long exercise and not confined to a specific time. Our prayers should be frequent and regular, echoing what Sha'ul said in 1 Thessalonians 5:17 "Pray without ceasing."

## **Weekly Sabbath Offerings**

### Numbers 28:9-10

- The Sabbath offering, over the regular daily offering, underscores the significance of the seventh day of the week to be completely dedicated to rest and worship (Exodus 20:8-10).
- 2. Its serves as reminder of Elohim's creative and redemptive work.

3. It also foreshadows our rest in Yeshua HaMashiach (Hebrews 4:9-10).

# **Monthly Offerings**

### Numbers 28:11-15

- 1. The monthly offerings were to be made at the beginning of each month (Numbers 10:10).
- It represents our need to start each new phase with a conscious acknowledgment on our dependence on Elohim.
- 3. It also teaches us Provers 3:6, In all your ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct your paths. (Yashar) to be made prosperous or right.

# Passover and Feast of Unleavened Bread

### Numbers 28:16-25

- 1. The Passover was a commemoration of our deliverance from Egypt (Exodus 12).
- 2. It also reminds us of our deliverance from the bondage of sin through Messiah, the Perfect Passover Lamb. (1 Corinthians 5:7).
- 3. The Feast of Unleavened Bread we all know is a seven day period following Pesach, it signifies believers journey in sincerity and in truth, without the leaven of malice and wickedness. (1 Corinthians 5:8).

#### The Feast of Weeks

#### Numbers 28:26:31

- The Feast of Weeks also called Shavuot falls exactly 50 days after Passover. The Israelites offered new grain, which signified Elohim's provision and blessing.
- 2. It foreshadows the pouring out of the Ruach HaKodesh on the day of Shavuot (Acts 2:1-4).
- 3. This feast always reminds us to be in gratitude for Elohim's blessings and provision.

# **Take Away**

- 1. The blessing is not keeping the Sabbath because Sabbath is the blessing.
- 2. Yehovah wants every time period and phase in our lives dedicated to Him.
- 3. We should be reminded of His Feasts and appointed times every chance we have.

# **Application**

- 1. Today I will rejoice that Yehovah has given us grace in reminding us of His times!
- I will remember to offering my best offerings to Yehovah during these times (Shabbat, Rosh Chodesh, Moedim).
- 3. I will remember when I am walking the calendar out yearly I am walking with Yeshua the

Living Torah. (Revelation 14:4).
