Seeds of Life Series: Torah the Seeds for Life

The Preservation of Man

Introduction

The question I would like to pose today is why did Yehovah decide to flood the whole entire earth and yet leave one family alive to be able to repopulate the earth? We have in this portion the preservation of not just man its much more so that just man it is the preservation of seed.

Not just any seed by the Seed of the woman would also be transported on that ark through Noah's son Shem. So this is much more than just some story about Noah and his wife and sons and their wives coming onto the ark. Let's see the importance of it.

Noah the Protector of the Seed

Genesis 7:18-22

1. Noah was the only one that Yehovah promised the seed too. If you don't believe me read Genesis 5 with the exhaustive list of genealogies and see what I mean.
2. Yehovah specifically makes a covenant with Noah and that He shall enter the ark with his family and with specific animals to specifically keep them alive.
3. Noah did according to all that Yehovah commanded him and He did so exactly. The word in Hebrew for commanded is tzivah where we get our word mitzvah.

Noah The High Priest of the Seed

Genesis 8:15-18

1. Yehovah commanded Noah out of the ark because the flood was over so he could finish completing his covenant with him.
2. Up until then they were vegetarian but this is where Yehovah gave them permission to eat meat and so here is the commandment. Even the vegetarian is to eat a piece of lamb for

Pesach to be obedient.

3. Noah built an altar to Yehovah and he took of ever clean domestic animal and of every clean bird and he offered burnt offerings on the altar. It became a soothing aroma to Yehovah and He promised that he would not ever flood the earth again.

Noah the Cultivator of the Seed

Genesis 8:22-9:4

1. Yehovah promised that the days of the land remain seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night will not cease. He is keeping His promise.
2. Yehovah again reiterated the covenant He made with Adam and now with Noah which was be fruitful and multiply.
3. However this time the animals will be afraid of mankind now.

The Rainbow Covenant of Noah

Genesis 8:8-17

1. The rainbow is connected to Noah and His seed. This is sign was between Man, animals and Yehovah that He would never destroy the earth again.
2. He made the covenant with Noah and His seed. Very Important!
3. The covenant will be a perpetual covenant that Yehovah made as a sign between Him

and all flesh the tis not the land.

Noah the Progenitor of The Seed

Genesis 9:18-28

1. the Bible calls Noah a Man of the soil and he was the first to plant a vineyard. He drank some of the wine and got drunk and was uncovered in His tent. The Hebrew word there is shacar which means drunk.
2. Ham conspicuously told his brothers about his dad. He basically attracted attention to him in a mocking way and when Noah woke up He cursed Ham's descendants which later became the Canaanites. From the Canaanites came Canaanite religion...it was a spiritual curse.
3. Because Shem and Japheth treated their father respectfully He blessed them and even prophecies that the Japheth will dwell in the tents of Shem. This is an early prophecy of the Gentiles dwelling with the Jews one day. We are not living that prophetic reality right now. Japheth won't dwell in His own tents but will dwell in Shem's tents.

Take Away

1. Yehovah will preserve His seed to save all of mankind.
2. Yehovah allowed us to eat meat after the flood because there was no vegetation.
3. The curse of Ham was the curse that the Canaanites would be walking in a perverse way

it was not about race.
