

LESSON PLAN

Biodiversity

Stages 3-4

SUMMARY

Biodiversity is the variety of different kinds of living things that exist in a particular area. Different animals and plants need different things in their habitat, so areas with a wider variety of things in the habitat will also have a wider variety of species living there.

DURATION

One to two 45-minute classroom periods.

MATERIALS

- Computer or tablet
- Binoculars for watching birds
- Magnifying glass for viewing insects
- Drawing paper

ENGAGE

Have students complete the interactive lesson sheet to introduce them to the concept of biodiversity.



Have students complete the interactive activity sheet by observing two different areas such as their front yard and back yard, or different areas in a local park or school.



After completing the interactive exercise, have a discussion about which areas had a greater number of insects and vertebrate animal species, and if these same areas also had a greater variety of habitat features.

ELABORATE

Have students design and draw an imaginary habitat and include which species they think could live there.

EVALUATE

Students can play the online Kahoot! quiz game located at the bottom of the list of learning materials.
