The church definitely needs more volunteers to help out with the Power Point and Zoom Hub operation during our worship services. We are down to three Power Point preparers and two Zoom Hub operators. Because the Zoom Hub coordinators also do PP, it is really just three people doing these two important jobs in our worship services each week. The three of us need your help.

There are some upcoming dates where as of now, we will only have Zoom, without PP. Now, that isn't the end of the world. We can always use our hymnals (old school!), but the presentations do positively add to the ambiance and overall experience of worship. While we can do without them, it is more important that we have a Zoom Hub operator each week. As of now, we won't have one on October 12th. That means that the members of our church family who join us online each week won't be able to attend that day which is very unfortunate.

Power Point is a little harder to learn, and requires the volunteer to have their own laptop. But, the Zoom Hub is very easy to learn. It is easier now than it used to be due to some changes in the procedure for setting it up and breaking it down after worship. Carl and I would love to help you learn how to do it (and PP too, and I'm sure Beth would help with that one also). I will be at church at 10:00 am on September 7 to set up Zoom. If you are interested in learning how to do this, and want to potentially volunteer to help us out (even just being able to fill in once every 2-3 months when Carl and I are both gone like on the 12th), please come and learn how we do it. A PP training needs to be scheduled for those interested in it, so stay tuned for more information on that.

They have appreciated the space for healing in NA groups, the chance to participate in Fair Trade giving at the Global Holiday Faire, the visible support of the LGBTQ+ community. They notice that we show up and follow through and work for justice. We have a reputation! And it's one I am so proud of.

In these times our role in the neighborhood may become more and more important. I pray that we will continue to be an anchor for hope and healing among our neighbors. We can provide welcome and safety and love when people are lonely and aching for justice. Our voice and our ministry is needed now, more than ever, and I am so glad to be serving alongside all of you as we make a difference in this place.

• Monthly Donation for September - NORTHBAY RAPID RESPONSE NETWORK

The Northbay Rapid Response Network (Serving Napa, Solano, and Sonoma Counties) is a 24/7 telephone hotline for immigrants and their families facing ICE (Immigration and Customs Enforcement) raids and possible risk of deportation. This hotline is one of a collection of similar urgent response outlets affiliated with the California Collaborative for Immigrant Justice (CCIJ). Once contacted, the Rapid Response Network dispatches trained legal observers to the suspected raid location. Network staff provide legal defense to impacted people and their families, witness to enforcement actions, and provide services to affected Northbay residents. Additionally, the Network provides education on knowing one's rights, monitors conditions in detention facilities, and operates an Immigrant Legal Resource Center. The Rapid Response Network is a bulwark for upholding the rights of immigrants. We all need to be educated on our Constitutional Rights and the rights of our immigrant neighbors. In addition to carry-in meals and social and spiritual support, the volunteers will assist unhoused persons with trips to local laundromats. Quarters are provided when needed to operate the washers and dryers. Clean clothes mean dignity and physical wellness for unhoused individuals. Please donate your change for a change of clothing for someone. Quarters only, please. We will forward the coins to Vallejo Together once a month. Thank you!
