#### Earth Month Worship in May

As I write this it is April 22nd, Earth Day. Happy Earth Day! In 2025 our Easter Sunday celebration fell on what would typically be a Sunday we celebrate creation, so our worship planning team suggested that we celebrate Earth Month instead. For the Sundays in May (except May 18th/Mental Health Sunday) our worship will focus on different areas of creation, earth stewardship and earth justice. For as the earth bursts with spring wildflowers, and as a garden cascades with blossoms, So the Lord God brings righteousness into full bloom and puts praise on display before the nations.

~Isaiah 65:11 (MSG)

Every time I spend time in my garden I feel grateful. My hands get to touch the earth, I get to be a part of new life. I take in the wonder and variety of creation. I feel like a partner in making things beautiful and creating joy. I love to see the butterflies and the hummingbirds as they pass through. Even when it's hard work, it feels good.

Unfortunately, I have not spent enough time in my garden this year. The weeds that are easy to pull up in March when the ground is wet have grown waist high in some spots. Many of the blooms are obscured behind thick green growth. I'm a bit sad that I haven't been able to get out there as much as I would have liked so far, but I know it's not the end of the world (or my garden). The work will get done or it won't and the butterflies and hummingbirds will still come. I won't have the same demands on my time forever and next year doesn't have to be the same. It will be okay.

What's cool is that the flowers are blooming, anyway. They have what they need to grow and even when I can't give them as much care as I would like, there they are. This is especially true of our artichoke bush - every year we get more and more artichokes without hardly doing a thing! Amazing. Beauty and abundance can burst through even in times when ability or effort are stretched thin. Flourishing can still take place.

Isaiah spoke of this same commitment that God made to the Israelites in captivity: Just as seeds planted in the soil inevitably grow, so too will God's promises be fulfilled, bringing joy and fulfillment to God's people. Isaiah aimed to lift the people's spirits by reminding them that God had a plan for redemption and restoration. He prophesied about the One who would come to bring good news, comfort and liberation.

In the midst of it all that challenges us - overgrown gardens, stretched budgets, broken hearts or broken promises, an uncertain future - may we remember to trust in God. The risen Christ shows us again that God's promises of new life are still at work in the world. Joy and restoration have already been planted. They will bloom and we will delight in their bounty.



#### MISSION ACTION UPDATES - Allison Mezzera

In honor of Earth Day, the April Mission Action donation will go to Climate Justice Alliance (CJA). CJA was formed in 2013 to unite frontline communities and organizations who work for climate justice. Their mission states:



- "Our translocal organizing strategy and mobilizing capacity is building a Just Transition away from extractive systems of production, consumption and political oppression, and towards resilient, regenerative and equitable economies. We believe that the process of transition must place race, gender and class at the center of the solutions equation in order to make it a truly Just Transition."
- 1) Inspire and organize bold action by communities on the frontlines of climate change to challenge the extractive economy that is harming people and ecosystems;
- 2) Build resilient, regenerative and equitable economies rooted in place-based webs of social and ecological relationships;
- 3) Expose false promises posed as 'solutions' to the climate crisis, so that precious resources are not allocated to programs that exacerbate social or economic inequality or cause further ecological disruption;
- 4) Confront governments and industry to act boldly on climate change.

"Outreach - We strive to end discrimination and stigma for all those persons affected by mental illness through broader education and collaboration with the whole community."

"Advocacy - We advocate for the rights of those living with mental illness and their families on the local, state and national levels, striving to raise awareness of mental health issues and improve access to quality care."

If you guessed that Pentecost was 40 days after Easter, you were close but not quite! Pentecost is actually 50 days after Easter, as we will see when June rolls around. So what is

the significance of **40** during Eastertide? Jesus remained on the earth for **40** days following his Resurrection, appearing to the women, to disciples, and other believers. On the **40th** day after the Resurrection, Jesus took some of His disciples up to a mountain top and rose up through the clouds into the heavens, leaving the disciples behind and bewildered. There are three scriptural references of the Resurrection: Mark 16:19-20 - Luke 24:44-53 - Acts 1:1-14. Read especially the story from Acts of the Apostles before Ascension Thursday, this year on May 29th, the **40th** day of Eastertime.
