

Rules for Arena/Grounds Use During Public Riding

1. Helmet Requirement for Riders Under 18:

Riders under the age of 18 must wear properly fitted and secured ASTM/SEI-approved helmets while mounted.

2. Footwear:

Riders must wear appropriate footwear with a closed toe and a defined heel.

3. No Running:

Running or excessive speed is not allowed in the arena.

4. Direction of Travel:

Establish a specific direction for riders to follow while in the arena. This helps prevent collisions.

5. Passing Etiquette:

Overtaking another rider should be done at a walk or slow trot, and only in a designated passing area.

6. Announce Changes of Gait:

Riders should announce their intention to change gaits (walk, trot, canter) to prevent surprises for other riders.

7. Maintain Safe Distances:

Riders should maintain a safe distance from each other to avoid crowding and potential accidents.

8. No Jumping without Permission:

Jumping is only allowed with the explicit permission of the instructor or facility manager.

9. Controlled Mounting and Dismounting:

Riders must mount and dismount in designated areas, ensuring control of their horse at all times.

10. No Unattended Horses:

Horses should not be left unattended in the arena. A responsible adult should be present when a rider is not mounted.

11. Take Your Manure with You:

Riders are responsible for cleaning up and taking their horse manure with them to help keep maintenance costs down.

12. Respect for Instructors and Other Riders:

Equine Event Services Rules for Arena Use During Public Riding All riders should show respect for instructors, fellow riders, and their horses.

13. No Unauthorized Training Equipment:

Only approved training equipment should be used in the arena, and its use must be authorized by the instructor.

14. Cell Phone Use:

Cell phone use should be limited to emergencies only. No texting or talking while riding.

15. Emergency Procedures:

You are responsible for knowing the establish emergency procedures, including how to exit the arena quickly and safely in case of an emergency.

16. No Dogs in the Arena, must be leashed:

For safety reasons, dogs are not allowed in the riding arena. County of San Diego mandates **all** dogs must be leashed at all times. Failure to control your dog will result in you and your guests being asked to leave the property immediately.

17. Arena Maintenance:

Report any maintenance issues with the arena footing, fencing, or lighting promptly.

18. Arena Hours:

The arena is open from 10 am to 3 pm on designated days. Any changes are at the discretion of Equine Event Services representatives.

19. Guest Policy:

Establish rules for guests and visitors in the arena, including whether they are allowed to ride and any associated fees.

20. Compliance with Facility Policies:

All riders must adhere to the facility overall rules and policies.

21. Right to Refuse Service:

Equine Event Services reserves the right to refuse service to anyone for non-compliance with facility rules or for any other reason deemed necessary for the safety and well-being of participants and horses.

22. Number of Riders In Arena At Any Given Time:

Equine Event Servies reserves the right to limit the amount of horses in the arena to insure rider safety during open riding sessions.

23. No Lunging In The Arena.

Absolutely no lunging in any arenas to ensure rider safety.

25. Children 17 and under must be supervised by an adult:

In case of emergency parents must be present supervising underage children.

26. No Tying Horses In Arena During Open Ride

Horses are to be tied in designated areas or to your trailer.
