We have also provided assistance and support to our sick and shut in, our Widows and others within our Order who were directly impacted by the Pandemic.

In the wake of the murder of George Floyd, I issued a statement condemning the acts of brutality that led to his death and further pledged to consistently speak out against and fight institutional racism with whatever resources we have at our disposal. In furtherance of this pledge, Master Masons in virtually every District throughout this Jurisdiction engaged in peaceful protests, marches, and assemblies in support of Racial Justice and Equity and against discriminatory policing practices and other racial disparities. All was done decently and in order. Prince Hall and those who came before us to establish the proud and historic legacy upon which we continue to build would demand nothing less of their Lagatees.

The Voter Awareness' Voter Education Committee has been one of our most active and engaged committees. They have done an extraordinary job of ensuring that both the Masonic family and the communities we serve were provided valuable and timely information on absentee voting and all other aspects of exercising the sacred right to vote. Their efforts, in large measure, contributed to the historic level of turn out in the most consequential election of our lifetime. We thank them for honoring the legacy of our late Brother Hon. John R. Lewis.

The Scholarship Foundation Fundraiser was a tremendous success. The Fundraiser Committee did an extraordinary job under some of the most challenging circumstances. The Campaign successfully raised in excess of \$44,000.00 during a time when the need of our recipients and their families was at its greatest. I thank you for your efforts in support of the Prince Hall Scholarship Foundation.

These things that we have accomplished thus far, individually and collectively, are the things that affect positive change in the condition of individuals, families, and neighborhoods; the kind of impactful change exemplified by our Founder and Patriarch, Prince Hall. I thank the Prince Hall Phamily for your laudable efforts to date, but there is still much work yet to be done. Let us strive to continue to emulate that which he exemplified.

First Lady Cheryl and I are eternally grateful for all of the Love and Support shown to us and our entire family during the Recognition Banquet Weekend celebration. 






FROM THE DESK OF THE **RW Deputy Grand Master** Jerry R. Ellerson



Don't go without God

A message by Rev. Dr. James H. Willis, Sr.

SCRIPTURE: And he said, My presence shall go with thee, and I will give thee rest. Exodus 33:14.

Introduction — My Brothers and My Sisters ...we are in the beginning of a brand New Year (2021) and we thank God for allowing us one more day...As we have approached this end we are on board again, and as Masons and Eastern Stars, we are blessed to have one more chance... We are grateful for All of the Associate Grand Chaplains that we have across the state... Even though God Called our Past Grand Chaplain home from labor to reward, Bishop Ellis...We were still able to pray during this past year as a group, and God Blessed us, because He was in the midst..

Many parents have watched their children step into their futures only to see them years later ,totally different from the way they left... Some never saw or heard from their children again. It was if they had stepped into a different world and left them behind...What am I saying? As Brothers and Sisters, we have made it through 2020 with eight months of the COVID-19 and God kept a hedge around us. Many were sick, some passed away, but God never left us...He said He would never leave us, or would He forsake us, and it is true that He has proven to do just that. Even though we were in the midst of the pandemic, God never left us. That tells us that we must pray to God for guidance...If the truth be told, many of us don't pray to God for guidance, we try to wing it on our own. Let's take advantage of the opportunities that we have before us here in 2021...

Tragically, many also have left God behind...Stepping into your future without God should never be an option for believers... It is very little we can do in any given year that does not require the miraculous intervention of the divine. Whether it's putting a safety net around our homes or creating opportunities for us on the job, God is busy 24 /7, making things happen for His people... That's what He did for us last year in the midst of all that took place across the Country and He will continue to do this year ... The song writer says "without Him, we will surely fail.

As Brothers and Sisters of this Masonic Family... we approach the New Year with renewed hope and enthusiasm... No matter what prospect the future offers, we should not step into it, leaving our faith and trust in God behind...

Exposition — This text focuses on a promise made to Moses by God Himself... It was a promise that His presence would be with the people as they travel into the land of Promise...During the desert journey, Moses realized that to continue he must experience the accompanying Presence of God... Therefore, he went into the Tabernacle to commune with God and sought His favor... When Moses went in the Tabernacle, the people stood to reverence this divine meeting and the Pillar of Cloud, that guided them by day, hovered over the Tabernacle. God and Moses had a heart to heart talk in which Moses plead for God's presence as the people faced the unknown. In response to Moses' earnest request, God reassured him. in Exodus 33:14 "My Presence will go with you, and I will give you rest."

I write this message to let you know that this New Year God promised His presence to the people back then and He will do the same thing for us this coming Year even with all that we have been through during 2020...

God's Promise of His presence came with the infallibility of a prophecy and the sovereignty of a fiat: "My presence shall go with thee." It is personal, intimate, minute, and appropriate...

With that Promise, Moses was confident that Israel's journey into the land of Promise would be a blessed pilgrimage... I serve notice to tell you that have been elected to your office for the incoming Year, that you need to look to God for help and "Don't go without Him."

Let us look at some of the ...Reasons we need God...

POINT #1 — WE NEED GOD TO LIFT OUR SPIRITS: When Israel saw the approaching armies of Egypt, their spirits dropped low. They believed that all was lost and that there was no hope. While God stood between them and destruction, He provided strong support for them as they wondered how they would make it. It was Moses who ultimately declared, "Stand Still and see the salvation of the Lord." He has given us emotional support, as well...

This has been a challenging year for some of us in our Lodges and Chapters... Some of our families encountered physical sickness and death during this COVID season... Others experienced strained relationships... Most believers will quickly testify that if it had not been for the Lord on their side, they would not have been able to stand the trials and difficulties of these tough moments...

Despite the enemy behind us and the Red Sea in front of us, we have been sustained by the eternal presence of God this past year...Many of us don't believe it... When difficult times were upon us, God was there like a wall of fire to protect us... Someone can recall how the Lord lifted a burden from your shoulder and gave them renewed strength in the midst of weakness... When Jesus told His disciples ... in Matthew 28:20 "Lo, I'll be with you always" that meant exactly what it said. He planned to be with us continually protecting our back......We need the presence of God to continually lift our spirit and remind us that we are never alone..

POINT #2 — WE NEED GOD TO PROVIDE FOR US: No matter how successful we may appear in our Lodges and Chapters and it's evident that we are still meeting virtual ... we always need God's help...God has been faithful in providing us with all the resources we needed in the past just as He did Israel when it moved through the wilderness for forty years. During that entire time, they depended upon the faithfulness of God...

In the wilderness, Israel found that God provided them food, on time every day; even though they complained about it. He fixed it such that the material that formed their tents held up for 40 years with no need of repair. He arranged it so that they wore the same shoes and clothes for decades and they never wore out. The food came on time every day. There was water just when they needed it most. God was faithful to Israel as he provided for them in ways no one could explain.

He has been faithful to us in the same way. No matter how we look at it, we have been blessed by the powerful hand of God...

There are so many intangibles and unforeseen elements that we face in our journey that we can't handle it well, in the spirit of godly submission, without God's help.

We need help with Lodges and Chapters...We need help with our finances... We need help with our health...

We need help in so many ways that we continuously sing with the songwriter, "I need thee, oh I need thee. Every hour, I need thee. O bless me now my savior, I come to thee."

POINT#3 — WE NEED GOD FOR PEACE AND REST: We cannot go into this New Year (2021) without God because He, and He alone can give us peace and rest... Peace of mind is rooted in assurance...Those who know that God is providing, protecting, and guiding have an element of confidence that is more valuable than gold...

This is the assurance that we have that as we go forward, that the Lord Himself will keep us company.

His presence, which includes His favor, His fellowship, His care, and His power, shall be ever with us in every one of our marching's. This means far more than it says; for, in fact, it means all things. If we have God present with us, we have possession of heaven and earth. Go with me, Lord, and then command me where



thou wilt!

That knowledge gives us peace of mind and makes it possible for us to rest easy, even in high blood pressure moments. His presence will cause us to rest even when we are in stressful situations. Rest comes from the Comforter, from the Prince of Peace

It is an assurance worth singing about. That's why the songwriter wrote, "Blessed assurance, Jesus is mine. Oh, what a foretaste of glory divine. Heir of salvation, purchase of God... Born of his spirit... Washed in his blood."

We need God for peace and rest in the coming days; we dare not go forward without Him...

One of the main things we need to do is to praise God as we go forward.

Finally, my brothers and my sisters, as we go into this New Year, we should praise God all the way...Every time we get a new member in the Chapter or the Lodge, we should praise the Lord...

God promised Israel that as they marched forward into the unknown that He would be with them every step of the way...All along the way, He performed miracles for them...Along the way, He opened up the Red Sea, and they crossed on dry land...Along the way, He provided meat for them to eat and bread from heaven.

We have the assurance that what God did for Israel that He'll do for us today.

As we go into this New Year, we should be prepared to praise Him for every miracle He performs...

We should be prepared to acknowledge His mighty acts as He rolls back the Sea of Impossibility and rains down blessings on us...We should be prepared to praise Him for guiding with a spiritual cloud by day and a spiritual fire by night...

For everything He's going to do, we should praise Him...

A Journey of Faith Describing Sublime Prince Kenneth Smith's Fight Against COVID-19

The COVID–19 pandemic has affected the world and the United States especially hard. COVID–19 has affected many lives, loved ones, and our masonic order. L.D. Easton Consistory No. 21 has four of its members affected. One of our members who fought and still is fighting an unbelievable battle against tremendous odds is on his way to a miraculous recovery. Sublime Prince Kenneth Smith 32° is a member of L.D. Easton Consistory No. 21, Valley of Columbus, Orient of Ohio, was nominated to be Elevated to the 33rd degree (Class of 2020).

On March 26, 2020, Ken was admitted to Memorial Hospital in Savannah. Within 2 days he was placed into a medically induced coma to allow his body to fight the coronavirus. Initially his vitals were stable, but by March 30th he needed supplemental oxygen via a ventilator.

Finally, on May 1, 2020, Ken was declared COVID-19 free, but the virus had left his body extremely weak and damaged. Through it all Theresa maintained a positive

attitude with sincere faith in GOD.

The month of June brought improvement and weaning off the ventilator. As Ken regained his strength, he started occupational therapy at the Savannah hospital as the ability to be mobile and communicate had been robbed by COVID-19. With extensive rehabilitation at the hospital Ken improved so much he was transitioned to a center to further assist his rehabilitation on July 18, 2020. Praise the Lord!

This has been a tremendous journey and nothing short of a miracle! Ken was in a Coma for over 2 months!

Ken had a long way to go before he would be allowed to go home (6 to 8 weeks projected) On August 30, he came back home to his friends and family laden with signs, clapping and cheering for his return.

Things have since changed for Ken after he spent 100 days on a ventilator. He is known as the "Miracle Man," by his doctors and nurses who assisted in his recovery. After being told he would never wake up; be brain dead; and live in a nursing home for the rest of his life...he has defeated the odds through Christ," says Theresa. Ken is expected to make a full recovery. He says he has God to thank for bringing him safely home.

Herd icon Reggie Oliver dies at 66

HUNTINGTON - Marshall's football community is mourning the loss of one of its favorite sons.

Reggie Oliver, who served as quarterback of the Young Thundering Herd in 1971, passed away on Tuesday at the age

Marshall athletics issued a release on Oliver's passing just before 7 p.m. on Tuesday evening.

"We extend out deepest sympathies to Reggie's friends and family," the release said. "He was one of Marshall's true legends and will sorely be missed by the entire Thundering Herd family."

Last week, Oliver was hospitalized at Huntsville Hospital in Huntsville, Ala., after suffering a serious head injury following

On Friday, the Marshall community came together at the Marshall Memorial Fountain outside of the Memorial Student Center and had a candlelight vigil for Oliver, which included Marshall's athletics staff, Marshall head coach Doc Holliday and the entire Marshall football team.

"I'm very saddened by this," Marshall athletic director Mike Hamrick said by phone on Tuesday. "It just doesn't seem fair." Holliday was alerted to Oliver's passing following the team's Tuesday session.

"It's a shame," Holliday said. "He was a great guy, a great Son of Marshall. He did so much for our program in so many ways.

The vigil occurred at the same fountain that Oliver delivered a powerful speech to Marshall patrons back on April 28 when Marshall took part in its annual Spring Fountain Celebration to turn on the fountain prior to the annual Green-White Spring

Holliday noted Oliver's passion as one attribute that immediately stood out when players first met him.

"He always had a smile on his face and was just so positive about everything," Holliday said. "Every time he spoke, he just had so much passion for everything he did. He was a great, great man that will always be remembered as a great Son of Marshall."

On that day, Oliver's powerful personality stood out.

As The Herald-Dispatch's Tim Stephens noted, the Tuscaloosa, Ala., native wore a white suit with a green tie and sunglasses to the event and sang the 1970 Clarence Carter hit "Patches" for those in attendance, which was about a boy raised in poverty in Alabama.

"People said not to go to Marshall," Oliver recalled. "They said, 'They'll make a wide receiver out of you.""

As it turned out, Oliver not only became a quarterback for the Young Thundering Herd, he became one of the program's biggest icons, forging Marshall to one of the banner wins in program history.

On Sept. 25, 1971, Oliver connected with freshman fullback Terry Gardner on a play called "213 Bootleg Screen" for a 13-yard touchdown on the game's final play as Marshall upset Xavier, 15-13, in front of an estimated 13,000 fans at Fairfield Stadium in Huntington. It was the first home game for the Herd since the 1970 Marshall plane crash of Southern Airways Flight 932. which occurred on Nov. 14, 1970 on the way back from a 17-14 loss at East Carolina.

Since that time, Oliver served as an assistant coach for the Herd under Sonny Randle and had also served as a teacher at Huntington High.

Oliver later moved to Columbus, but had returned to his home state of Alabama to take care of his mother in recent months.
