# MWPH Grand Lodge of Ohio Convenes 161st Grand Communication

Jones and he carried his theme out to perfection as the Prince Hall Masons descended on the City of Cincinnati from July 31 - August 4, 2010, for the 161st Grand Communication of the MWPH Grand Lodge of Ohio.

The Grand Session began on Saturday afternoon at the Millennium Hotel when the Prince Hall Scholarship Foundation presented its 2010 Aron Moss, Jr. Awards Program. During the program we received the annual Foundation message from the Executive Director, Mr. Ronald A. Ogletree, who then presided over the presentation of the Scholarship Awards. This year the Foundation gave scholarships to 19 first-time students and 24 continuing education students for a total of \$27,600.00. A special award of \$500.00 was also presented to Wilberforce University.

The keynote speaker was Mr. Mycal J. Carr, a Huber Heights Wayne High School graduate who received his scholarship and continuing support throughout his college career, graduating from Howard University with a degree in Accounting. He has accepted employment with the Department

The majority of the scholarship funds are derived by holding a raffle each year and this year was no exception. 

It was our goal to make this session informative, educational and enjoyable; we wanted to give everyone some personal motivation to attend. The initial reports are positive, but we ask you to forward your critique to this office or to one of the other Elected or Appointed Grand Lodge Officers so that we can continue the evaluation process as we plan for 2011.

You, the Brethren, are to be commended for without your financial participation we would not have had the success that we did enjoy at this Communication. I thank you for your concern and your personal sacrifice during these difficult economic times. Because of your efforts this Grand Communication paid for itself. This is a his-

In 2011 in Columbus at the Renaissance Hotel we will have another evening of relaxation. Gerald Alston, the lead singer for the Manhattans, and Wilbert Longmire, nationally known jazz guitarist, will perform for us on Saturday, August 6th. There will be a limited time when tickets will be available only to our Masons and Eastern Stars; after that we will market to the public. There will only be 600 tickets available for this event. We continue to work toward the completion of the 3987 E. Main Street property in Whitehall. We have received the rezoning approval, completed geotechnical studies which we hope will allow for the permanent financing by the time you read this. Brothers, we still need for us to step up as members of this great Jurisdiction and financially support this project. If you can't make the requested donation in a lump sum, please consider a systematic donating plan that will best fit your circumstances and that of the project. 
## From the Desk of the RW Senior Grand Warden DARRYL R. SMITH, PM, #121

### **PH Family of Cincinnati Holds Thanksgiving Basket Distribution**

The Prince Hall Family of Greater Cincinnati (Masons, Order of Eastern Stars, Shriners, etc.) conducted its 10th Annual Thanksgiving Basket Distribution, and for the 10th year it was a success. Five hundred plus baskets were constructed and distributed over a two day period at the Bond Hill Recreation Center, 1501 Elizabeth Place, Cincinnati, Ohio.

Under the leadership and guidance of Past Masters Kenneth McCullars and Otis Elam, a welloiled machine has been created and the daunting tasks necessary for success have been converted to a shared activity full of excitement, fun and harmony. With the assistance of approximately 200 Masonic family volunteers, Brothers and Sisters worked tirelessly to make this project a success, but none worked harder than the MW Grand Master, Robert L. Jones. The MW Grand Master didn't shy away from any task requiring attention and motivated volunteers by the personal energy he demonstrated to keep the pace needed to get the job done.

In 2001, then MW Grand Master Sidney D. Broadnax, Jr., observing the efforts of individual lodges in the 1st Masonic District to serve the community at Thanksgiving, provided the necessary leadership to create a new model that has proven to be more efficient and cost effective. By pooling resources, the program has grown from distributing 167 baskets the first year, to distributing over 500 baskets this past weekend. Such growth success led MW Grand Master Robert L. Jones to envision the program growing to the 1000 basket distribution level in the future. Currently, all funding is provided by the Prince Hall

Masonic Family, and the food costs have been reduced thanks to the relationships that have been developed with community vendors supportive of this activity and the consistency of the activity's leadership.

While this year's program was clearly a success, the Prince Hall Family, recognizes the need to do more. It is hoped that as the program developes corporate assistance one day will allow for its envisioned expansion. It should be noted that the unique success of this program was recognized by the attendance of four Past MW Grand Masters: MW Past Grand Master Chester C. Pryor II, MW Past Grand Master Steven Reece, Sr., MW Past Grand Master Sidney D. Broadnax, Jr. and MW Grand Master Robert L. Jones.

Sovereign Grand Inspector General (S.G.I.G.) Ernest W. Terry and Most Worshipful Past Grand Master was born in Memphis, Tennessee. He married Mildred McKinney also of Memphis.

In 1952 he was initiated into William T. Boyd Lodge No. 79, and served as Worshipful Master. Other Masonic Affiliations: Past High Priest of Cuyahoga Chapter No. 36, Royal Arch Mason; member of Bezaleel Consistory No. 15, Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite of Free Masonry; Sir Knight of Emmanuel Commandery No. 32, Knight Templar; member of Wisdom Chapter No. 51, O.E.S.; Companion of Adoniram Council No. 1, Royal and Select Mason; Illustrious Past Potentate of El Hasa Temple No. 28; and Past Deputy of the Desert of Ohio, A.E.A.O.N.M.S.

The ultimate honor that he attained was being elected "Most Worshipful Grand Master of Masons for the Most Worshipful Prince Hall Grand Lodge of Ohio" in August, 1989. He was coroneted a 33° Degree Mason, A.A.S.R. in



May 1973. Elevated to the position of Illustrious Deputy of the Orient and Most Illustrious Commanderin-Chief in May 1996, a position he held until his health began to fail.



# From the Desk of the Grand Orator...

#### **RW FANON RUCKER**

On January 12, 2010, the world shook violently with a magnitude seven earthquake in the small poor nation of Haiti. MW Grand Master Robert L. Jones pointed out in his allocution, it is estimated that over two hundred fifty thousand people lost their lives, a million made homeless and hundreds of thousands injured. The worldwide outpouring of support and supplies to one of the globe's poorest nations was a particularly visible testament to the sympathetic nurturing spirit that exists in most humans.

Our Masonic charge encourages us to be particularly charitable to those less fortunate than ourselves, and thanks to the purposeful leadership of our Grand Master, the MWPH Grand Lodge of Ohio, collected and sent donations to our distressed Brothers and Sisters. The needs of the tiny nation were magnified due to the extremely destitute conditions of its people. But, there is a reason Masons should be particularly protective and empathetic toward Haiti.

In 1791, Haiti experienced the only successful slave revolt in the Western hemisphere. Following the example, and riding the wave, of independence created by America fifteen years earlier and by the French Revolution some two years prior, an ex-slave, a devout Christian and a courageous, fearless leader by the name of Toussaint L'Ouverture broke the chains of manumission for his people. The armies led by this man defeated the Spanish, the French and Napoleon's army. Many have called this respected man "The Black Napoleon" — we, as Masons, call him Brother — yes, Brother.

L'Ouverture established Haiti as the first Black Free Independent Nation in the New World. No doubt the embarrassment over their defeat would ultimately contribute to it being closed off and choked by leaders of those hypocritical nations who also had shaken oppressive hands and then sought to keep Haiti from experiencing prosperity for doing the same thing.

Around the same time as Brother L'Ouverture was leading Haiti, another brave individual was seeking independence and freedom for another group of downtrodden and oppressed citizens. The man, Prince Hall, the country, the United States, Boston, Massachusetts in the late 1780's; the people were tory, men of commitment, men of African Americans, who in 1787 the State Legislature to grant freetheir White counterparts and have them? a country of their own to go to.

1797, a Prince Hall lodge was opened in Philadelphia with a charter received from the Grand Lodge and signed by Grand Master Prince Hall. This new lodge in Philadelphia had as its Worshipful Master and Treasurer Episcopal Priests by the names Brother Absalom Jones and Brother Richard Allen — of course, we now know these Brothfounders of the African Methodist Episcopal Church — the oldest African-American church here in Cincinnati bearing the name of Richard Allen.

Perhaps you and I have had a similar encounter — the other day a friend sent me a text and asked how I was doing — in undirected response, I said, "I'm existing" but Brothers, isn't there so much more to a purpose driven life than just "existing?" Would our esteemed founder have ever been satisfied on any given day by simply just "existing?" We are not unfamiliar with the names and accomplishments of people like Garret Morgan, John Johnson, Elijah Muhammad, Matthew Henson and Thurgood Marshall — these man accomplished great things during their lifetimes. These and hundreds of others are excellent members and representatives of our Ancient and Noble Fraternity — in fact, if you are like me, when people flatteringly mention Founders of this Nation or names like Marcus Garvey, you proudly offer that you are fastened by the bonds of the Order to these great men. But, acknowledging the charges we all received to diligently study the Great Light, to cheerfully and freely uplift and give to the downtrodden, to Live our Lives upon the Square — when we open our eyes each day are we living to the absolute fullest extent we are capable of?


We know that one day we will each be standing before the great white throne, there to receive judgment for deeds done while here in the body, but can you honestly say that great Masons throughout his-

Do something meaningful for the children you see in your neighborhood who have lost hope, initiate an effort to make contact with the lodge widows once a week, visit the elderly Brothers in your lodge each month or simply commit to pick people up and drive them to the polls on election day to support the local school levy that will, consistent with Prince Hall's desire, ensure the equal education of the next generation.

Brothers, we proclaim that our hope is that people will observe that when we are made a Mason, we made a better man. . . let us ensure the truth of that declaration, let us stop just looking good. .and sounding good ...but let us DO good ... and then proudly be able to proclaim — Yes! I am a Freemason! God Bless!




