Dear 1GMC Family,

All of us, from the youngest to the oldest, will be focusing on these topics together in Sunday worship, Sunday School, and Small Groups. In addition, this booklet provides information about what we believe God has designed as our next steps, the One Fund approach to giving, and answers to the most frequently asked questions about the campaign.

How can you participate in this season?

Lead with your prayers: Prayer is our first and foremost tool for any endeavor. Please join us in the daily prayers and devotional guides listed in this booklet. Also, at noon each day, please join us in our corporate prayer so that we may cry out to God together as one voice in thanksgiving and ask for His continued blessings upon us.

Follow with a joyful spirit: Be advocates for growth, mission work, and the ministries of our church. Show the love of Christ to those around you. Examine where God is leading you to work within our church – all are called, and all have a place to serve!

Support with your resources: All that we are, and all that we have, is from God alone (Rom. 11:36). We were created in His image to have dominion over the earth, to tend and care for it, and to tend and care for one another (Gen. 1:26-28; 1 Pet. 4:10). We are His stewards, given the task to spread the Good News of the Gospel to all the world (Matt. 28:19). What are your gifts? What are your talents? What has God given you to share in this mission?



OUR FUTURE

The current plans for the **initial phase** of our new facility will feature a 9,600 square foot building, to include a multi-purpose sanctuary, several classrooms and offices, a kitchen, and paved parking spaces.

Our **goal** is to break ground in early 2026 and complete construction in time to welcome the community for worship by Christmas 2027.

Future expansion plans to be constructed at a later date include a 5000 square foot formal sanctuary, extending from the south side of the initial building.

Let's Go!

WHAT IS A ONE FUND?

You may have been a part of church campaigns in the past where you were asked to give "above and beyond" your normal giving to fund special initiatives, like a new building. You designated your gifts, for example, to the "Operating Budget / General Fund" or the "Building Fund".

Through One Fund, IGMC will **merge these gifts** into **one single commitment**. This allows greater flexibility to fund our current ministry needs, like the Operating Budget / General Fund. First and foremost...we need to keep the lights on!

Once our current ministry needs are funded for the month, whatever commitment remains will go to our future ministry needs, which will include the new building.



WHY A ONE FUND?

We chose a One-Fund approach because our giving is ultimately to God through our church, trusting that He will use IGMC as a vessel to carry out His purpose.

Just like filling a bucket, our goal is to pour into this fund with generous hearts, knowing that once it is full, it will overflow into every area where it's needed most.

This isn't just about meeting budgets—it's about faithful, wholehearted generosity to God, believing **He multiplies what we give for His Kingdom work.**



DISCIPLESHIP JOURNEY

At IGMC, we believe giving is a journey. Our discipleship in generosity should be approached in the same way as the discipleship of the rest of our faith, and that means it is a process of growing more and more to love, think, and act like Jesus in who we are and how we give.



An **Initial Giver** is someone who decides to give for the first time, out of a response to God's Word about giving. This is someone who decides to give something and trust God and the leaders of the Church with this gift.

(2 Corinthians 8:7)



A **Consistent Giver** is someone who decides to give something and to give it on a consistent basis to exercise the discipline of giving as a disciple of Jesus. A tithe (10%) is a helpful and Biblically grounded guidepost for your giving, but Jesus shares that He isn't interested in an outward action void of a heart motivation.

(2 Corinthians 9:6-8)



A **Priority Giver** is someone who understands the preeminence of Christ and that He is before all things – that all things were created by Him, for Him, through Him, and to Him. This giver places such a significant priority on their giving that it drives their spending and their saving, as opposed to their spending and saving driving their giving.

(Colossians 1:15-18, 22-23)



A **Surrendered Giver** is someone who recognizes the power of the gospel and has surrendered to honoring God with 100% of their resources as a result. A Surrendered Giver is someone who gives in a way that changes them, in a way that reflects that the totality of their resources belong to God. A Surrendered Giver isn't just concerned with what they ARE giving but is more concerned with what they're NOT giving and why, and they seek to honor God with 100% percent of what He has given them, whether that means direct monetary giving or a God-honoring use of an existing resource.

(2 Corinthians 8:8-9)

Pray for our **growth** as committed followers of Christ, our mission as a disciple-making church, and our generosity to exceed our imagination, thus enabling us to glorify God in remarkable ways.

COMMIT FULLY



Together commit to have 100% engagement from IGMC in the Let's Go! Campaign. Commit to do whatever **God** calls you to do as we lean hard into the mission that Christ has given us.

GIVE GENEROUSLY



Ask God to show you how to give in a way that transforms your heart, and for courage to act in obedience to His calling.

CELEBRATE LOUDLY



Embrace the Let's Go! vision and be an **ambassador** of accurate information in your circle. Prepare in advance to **engage** meaningfully in the upcoming opportunities that will advance our shared mission.

SERMON NOTES

Generosity Toolbox

Nearly every day we make financial decisions—some small, some large, and some that look toward the future. Perhaps the most challenging of these decisions is the decision to give. Giving can create tension. We may ask ourselves, "If I give this away, how will the gap be filled?"

But Scripture reminds us that **everything we have comes first from the gracious hand of God**. When we give, we are not simply making a financial choice—we are responding in faith. Giving is an act of trust, a way of placing God's Kingdom first in our lives, and a spiritual discipline that shapes our hearts to rely on His provision.

The "Generosity Toolbox" is designed to help you reflect on God's blessings in your life and prayerfully discern how He is leading you to participate in Let's Go!.

Allow these resources to encourage you to listen for the Spirit's voice, to grow deeper in your faith, and to trust in the One who provides for all our needs.

SERMON NOTES

Lifestyle Generosity

The most effective path to generosity is a spiritual path where you set your heart on things above. Then, your financial priorities will naturally flow out of your spiritual priorities. People often describe this as "living a generous lifestyle." It is always a temptation to give to God in such a way that it makes little impact on how you live. The challenge of living a generous lifestyle is to intentionally and prayerfully find ways to do just that – to let your giving touch your living!

King David declared, "I will not give to God that which costs me nothing" (2 Samuel 24:24). He understood that the value of the gift presented to God is determined by its value to the giver. A gift that would touch the heart of God must first touch the life of the giver! This is the spirit of lifestyle generosity.

Lifestyle generosity is a level of giving that affects you – your plans, your activities, your attitude and your approach to life. It means giving up something in one area so that you can give more of yourself in another.

SERMON NOTES

The Generosity Journey

An **Initial Giver** is someone who gives for the first time, responding to God's Word and choosing to trust Him and their church leaders with this gift (2 Cor. 8:7–15).

A **Consistent Giver** begins giving regularly, often by setting up a recurring gift, as they develop the discipline of generosity (2 Cor. 9:6–8).

An **Intentional Giver** starts aligning their giving with other priorities, making it a deliberate choice that reflects their values (Luke 14:28–35).

A **Sacrificial Giver** gives in a way that costs them something, letting generosity govern their lifestyle in response to Christ's sacrifice (Col. 1:15–18, 22–23).

A **Lifetime Giver** looks beyond the month or year, setting long-term generosity goals that shape larger financial decisions like homes, cars, or investments (1 Tim. 6:6–19).

Why Turn in a Commitment Card?

One of our goals for Let's Go! is 100% participation. Completing a card is both a practical and spiritual step—it represents a decision, not a delay, and invites you to prayerfully assess your giving and growth.

A commitment card provides clarity for you and your family, helps leaders make wise plans, and symbolizes a step of faith in joining together as a church. Writing down a goal makes it real and creates accountability.

Think of it as a spiritual check-up: a chance to express gratitude, trust God with the future, and model stewardship for the next generation.

We invite you to participate—not because of what we want from you, but because of what we want for you.

SERMON NOTES

Thoughts on Generous Giving

There are many creative ways to give beyond your regular cash gifts:

- 1. Priority Budgeting Rearrange priorities by postponing expenses like a car, vacation, or remodel in order to give more to Let's Go!
- 2. Redirect Expenditures As certain expenses end (like tuition or loans), consider redirecting those funds toward your commitment.
- 3.Income Increases Salary raises or bonuses can be opportunities to increase generosity rather than lifestyle.
- 4. Personal Property Assets such as vehicles, jewelry, or collections can be sold and given.
- 5. Appreciated Assets Donating stocks or real estate avoids capital gains tax while providing a deduction for full market value.
- 6.Charitable IRA Rollover For those 70½ or older, up to \$100,000 can be transferred tax-free from your IRA each year, counting toward your required minimum distribution.
- 7. Legacy Giving Estate plans or wills can designate a portion for 1GMC, ensuring ministry impact for generations to come.
