
 Final dose of Polio must be on/after age of 4 years (4/3 doses)

- Must have a medical exemption











School immunization records must contain:

- ✓ Child's name
- ✓ Child's date of birth
- ✓ Name of vaccine
- ✓ Month, day, year when vaccine given
- ✓ Name/signature/initials of school person reviewing/providing the form
- ✓ Date provided

Arizona School Immunization Requirements: Kindergarten - 12th Grade

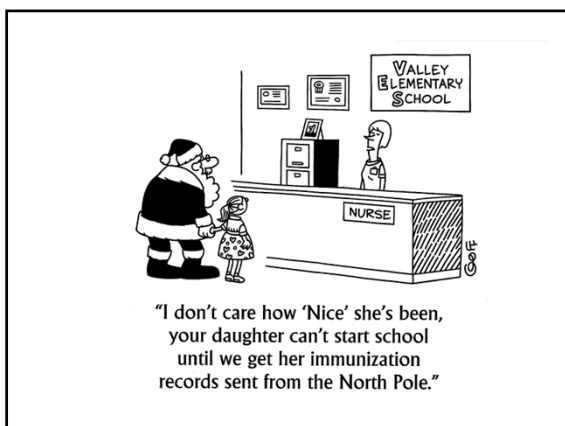
ADHS

Students must have proof of all required immunizations, or a valid exemption, in order to attend school. Arizona has strict requirements for required specific, non-exempt, and optional immunizations. Exemptions have to be signed from parents and #100 (www.adhs.gov/immunization/requirements/100) or #101 (www.adhs.gov/immunization/requirements/101).

Required immunizations are listed in the table below. Immunizations are required unless otherwise noted in the table or in the notes. The immunization schedule is based on the CDC's Recommended Immunization Schedule for Children - United States, 2014 (www.cdc.gov/vaccines/imz/downloads/pdf/051407a.pdf).

DTaP (Diphtheria/Tetanus/aP) and Tdap (Tetanus/diphtheria/aP)	4 doses: 2, 4, 18-24 months, and 4-6 years of age	1 dose: 11-12 years of age	1 dose: 11-12 years of age
Polio (Poliovirus)	4 doses: 12-15 months, 18-24 months, 3-5 years, and 4-6 years of age	1 dose: 11-12 years of age	1 dose: 11-12 years of age
Hepatitis B (HepB)	3 doses: 12-15 months, 18-24 months, and 4-6 years of age	1 dose: 11-12 years of age	1 dose: 11-12 years of age
Hepatitis A (HepA)	2 doses: 12-15 months and 18-24 months	1 dose: 11-12 years of age	1 dose: 11-12 years of age
Varicella (Chickenpox)	2 doses: 12-15 months and 4-6 years of age	1 dose: 11-12 years of age	1 dose: 11-12 years of age




