Since 1972, National School Nurse Day has been set aside to recognize school nurses. National School Nurse Day was established to foster a better understanding of the role of the school nurse in the educational setting. School Nurse Day is May 11, 2022.

The Yearly Sensory Screening Reporting for hearing and vision is currently open and will close June 30, 2022. Per [9 A.A.C. 13, Article 1](#) each school must submit a Hearing Screening Report. Vision Screening reports are not mandatory for the 21-22 school year as the vision rules have not been finalized by the State, but, if Vision Screening was conducted in your school please submit a Vision Screening Report. We have provided the following information on how to access and fill out the Reports: ***The Sensory Screening Program WILL NOT accept mailed reports.***
