
- The 2023-2024 Immunization Data Report (IDR) is now open.

- In April 2022 Seizure Safe Schools legislation was passed. The law requires that at least two people on a school campus be trained in providing first aid to an individual having a seizure.
 One of the trained individuals must be someone other than the school nurse or health assistant.
