Communication: The Foundation

- Nurse's Perspective: "Non-judgmental, honest, sensitive, active listening, etc.
- " Principal's Perspective: "No one like surprises."
 - Prior to students returning
 - Process, Procedures, & Protocols
 - Regular/Ongoing Communication
 - Process Review and Calendar Preview
 - 'In the moment' or Irregular Communication
 - Emergencies, Hostile Parents, etc.
 - Impact of FERPA on communication



Budget: Pencils vs Band-Aids



- It's the Law No Immunizations No School
 - Bodies in the seat vs Policy and Law
- Nurse's Perspective: "Here's what I need to do my job."
- Principal's Perspective: "We're broke. What are our kids not going to get this year?"
 - School Nurse Budget Prioritize needs
 - Donations





Children with Chronic Illness

- Nurse's perspective: "This is one of the primary focus areas of my time."
- Principal's perspective: "Insert yourself"
- Advocacy
- Be aware of legal implications of complaining about being out of compliance
- School nurse is part of the school organization
- Faculty Training
- The frequent fliers

Evaluation

- Nurse's Perspective: "You are not qualified to evaluate my nursing."
- Principal's Perspective: "Let's make sure we're looking through the same lens."
 - What is best process within state's guidelines for determining if the nurse
 - meets the requirements of the job?
 - What is valued in your school?
 - What are your outcomes?

Community Connections: Building Bridges

- Nurse's Perspective: "No time and I don't get paid."
- Principal's Perspective: "Be a part of the team."
 - You are a part of the larger school community Family Nights, PTA, Orientations, etc. You are a professional. Two-way street help nurse-help student
 - Homelessness
 - Truancy
 - Food Insecurity
 - School Safety

Rules – Best Practice

- Nurse's Perspective: "Evidenced based practice and student safety trumps all."
- Principal's Perspective: "I getting' hammered by the parents..."
- "Rules" vs. Culture
- Bake sales, Parties, Lice, Field Trips, etc. Feeding students

The School Nurse and the Principal Recommended Agenda Items for Admin & Nurse Communication

- All policies/laws that impact on the school nurse (e.g., screenings, immunizations, exclusions)
- Accessibility Schedule
- Budget/finances
- Children with Chronic Conditions 504/IEP/Behavior Plans/Chronic Illness/ Homebound
- School Nurse participation on teams/committees, "frequent fliers" and those with behavioral challenges who are NOT identified as having a chronic conditions.
- Common practice around information streams
- Communication with Administration, Community PTA, student orientations
- Communication with parents/guardians (caregivers) and hostile parent calls
- Coverage and substitute policy
- Emergency Protocols 9-1-1, Child Protective Services, Safety- Lockdown/Evacuation/Fire/Disaster etc.
- Evaluation (of the school nurse) Process
- Goals: mine (and how can I help you achieve yours?)
- Homeless/Truancy
- I shouldn't have to do that! ---- When you have no choice
- Language clarification jargon, building codes, etc.
- NASN Standards of Practice, State Nurse Practice Act, Emergency Guidelines
- Regular communication vs. prn communication
- School traditions/ rules
- Threat Assessments & Communication Suicide, Cutting, Violence, Overdose, Cyberbullying, etc.
- When to send children to the school nurse
