Purpose of Scholarship



E.M. "Nat" Watson Mr. "Coach Watson," born on May 2, 1910, in Boley, OK. Graduated from Boley High, Langston University, and retired from an illustrious career as a coach and principal from Dunbar High School in Shawnee, Ok. He had a major impact on the life and success of students. Known for his prowess as a football coach and his reputation for connecting with youngsters and team members, which continued throughout his career and afterwards. His household was a hub for families, community events, and roundtable discussions for educational and political alliances, but most importantly, a place for his students. This energetic atmosphere was the spark

that fueled Nat's personality. He was gregarious, interested in, and encouraging his students, friends, and neighbors. Coach Watson touched the lives of many of the athletics of the Shawnee High football players, including Bill Ford of Shawnee Milling Company and his football friends. So much so that, in return, they established a scholarship to contribute to his legacy of making a difference in the lives of young athletes, as Coach Watson did for so many.

Qualifications

This scholarship is open to male and female athletes who attend and graduate from an Oklahoma public school and participated in a recognized OSSAA sports program for at least two (2) years. The student must attend a college or university full time at an accredited institution in Oklahoma. Preference is given to but not limited to African American students. The scholarship funds are contingent upon availability each year and may vary. Recipients will be notified by writing or by phone call on or before May 1st this year. In addition, each recipient will receive an invitation to attend the Oklahoma African American Educators Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony banquet on September 26, 2025, at the Grand Casino Event Center in Shawnee, Oklahoma.

Value of the Award

One (1) 1,000.00 scholarship will be awarded per student for the second semester of the first year.
