


Different Types of Plans

Plan	Contents	Developed by:
Medical Management Plan (MMP)	Medical orders-all aspects of routine and emergency care	Student's personal healthcare provider (MD, NP, PA, etc)
Individualized Health Care Plan (IHP)	School Nurse care plan-how care, as prescribed in the MMP will be delivered in the school, directed by the school nurse	School Nurse (RN)
Emergency Care Plans (ECP)	Tool for school staff-how to recognize and treat an emergency such as hypoglycemia, asthma flair up, etc. What to do in an emergency	School nurse with input from other staff
504 Plan, Individualized Education Program (IEP), or other educational plans	Education plans address the students' needs for a free and appropriate public education. May include health services as part of the plan	504 Team ARD Committee

The Nursing Process



Assessment

- Comprehensive Nursing Assessment
 - RN does this assessment
 - LVNs can assist with gathering of the information to support the development of the IHP
 - Scope of Practice for RN and LVN outlines roles

Nursing Diagnosis

Based on Comprehensive Nursing Assessment



Not a medical diagnosis

NANDA-I (Previously North American Nursing Diagnosis Association)

Nursing Diagnosis leads to nursing interventions and nursing outcomes being developed

Nursing Diagnosis vs. Medical Diagnosis

Nursing Diagnosis, Medical Diagnosis, and Collaborative Problems

Nursing Diagnosis -

Ineffective Airway Clearance

Distrubed Body Image

Risk for Unstable Blood Glucose

Impaired Urinary Elimination

Self-Care Deficit: Dressing

Medical Diagnosis

Pneumonia

Amputation

Type 2 Diabetes Mellitus

Post-op Prostatectomy

Cerebrovascular Accident

Collaborative Problems

Potential complication of Head Injury: increased intracranial pressure

Potential complication of myocardial infarction: congestive heart failure

What is the IHP?

Formal nursing care document developed by the RN. Evidence of the nursing process

Developed by the RN with input from student, family and healthcare professionals

Utilized to plan care of students with healthcare needs that impact attendance and learning

Cannot be delegated to unlicensed personnel or assigned to the LVN



Who Can Develop IHP

languages recognized by the American Nurses Association

Most common is NANDA-I

Omaha System is an option for community health and is multidisciplinary Need common language to help coordinate care across the district and to help where substitute nurses are pulled in

Problem focused and geared towards community settings



3 Scheme Areas

Problem classification (Nursing Diagnosis) Intervention Scheme Problem Rating Scale for Outcomes



Problem Classifications-4 Domains Environmental Psychosocial Physiological Health-related Behaviors Students that are medically fragile

Students that require health services daily

IEP and 504 Services

Daily health services that require a nurse Students that have condition that could result in medical emergency

For example, an allergy or seizure disorder

Prioritization of IHPs

Format of IHPs

Based on preferences

- Simple
- Easy to navigate

Individualized

- Can start with template
- Work in the details

Updated

- At least annually
- When changes need to be made based on changes in condition or medical orders

IHP Activity

- This is the time where participants are allowed to discuss a student that may need an IHP written. It will be important to give them time to work on this so that they can utilize some of the tools provided.

Outlines and documents the nursing process-BON would ask to see IHP during any investigation




Prioritized by level of nursing care needs
