ON THE ROAD



We had another brewery event in Lakewood, Ohio, which confirmed that brewery events are some of the best! The attendees were from a range of communities in the area, and expressed a number of climate observations and concerns. Lake Erie is no longer freezing over in winter, which has been making for moist winter air and heavy snow. Summer temps are also higher, and major rain events are more frequent, causing major flooding and damage. In one community, "100 year flooding" events have occured 3 times in just the last decade.
