While in Peru, we visited Lake Titicaca. Not only is it one of the highest navigable lakes in the world (12,500 ft), but it is also home to a civilization that even pre-dates the Incas. These tribes have been able to reside in this region successfully for ages due in part to their

ability to live harmoniously with nature. They fish sustainably from the lake, and they build their tools and homes from materials that breakdown and return back to the ecosystem. Shockingly, they don't live on land. but rather on floating "islands" made out of reed plants. Yes, I'm referring to thick mats of vegetation that are literally floating on the lake. This is where they call home. Several times a year, these tribes add new dry reed to their island to replace that which has been swallowed by the lake. Why is the Climate Top Priority?

When we think of national priorities, climate change is often viewed as its own issue.



We think of poverty, immigration, violence, the economy, national security, and then, quite separately, we think "climate change."

However, a critical psychological transition that is necessary to expedite meaningful climate action is the realization that climate change is deeply tied to each

of these other issues. Take immigration; there are now more environmental refugees than political refugees. The new phrase "climate refugee" has evolved as a result. How about national security? The Pentagon identifies climate change as a major threat to political stability and U.S. military infrastructure. The economy? Future climate impacts are expected to cost the U.S. literally hundreds of billions of dollars by the end of this century, due to sea level rise, increased natural disasters, lost work hours, etc. Public health? Warming temperatures are expanding the ranges of mosquitoes and other vectors, bringing diseases such as malaria, Lyme disease, and Zika virus to new areas. Additionally, as climate impacts worsen, we can expect more conflict over dwindling water and land resources, particularly affecting impoverished communities. Because of its close inter-relatedness with a variety of top national priorities, there is no question that climate change is our top priority. The key is realizing the connection between climate change and other key issues. To contribute to the public's understanding of these connections, it's critical to discuss climate change in the context of other issues.
