<u>North Olmsted</u> meals on wheels is run by the City of North Olmsted through the North Olmsted Senior Center, 28114 Lorain rd. Meals are cooked and prepared at St. John WestShore Hospital and transported to the N. O. Senior Center, Currently, volunteer drivers for Mondays and Wednesdays, and substitute drivers are always needed, most volunteers deliver only one day a week, Monday thru Friday.

Volunteering in Your Parish

Perhaps the most rewarding liturgical ministry you can participate in is becoming an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion. It is the ministry most in need of volunteers, since large Parishes require from 40 to 70 distributors weekly, depending on the number of parish masses, whether the Eucharist is distributed under both species, and the number of distribution locations in the church.

There is an awesome realization by every distributor the first time he/she touches the Body of Christ that he/she has a duty and an obligation to seek reverence for the sacrament by the recipient, one on one. It is for this reason that the Cleveland Diocese requires a training session for candidates recommended by the pastor. The session includes the Theology of the Eucharist, and covers practical techniques on handling the sacrament. You only need to attend one Sunday session from 1 to 4:30 p.m. The closest location is St. Richard in North Olmsted on April 15th. If you are interested in this ministry, please contact your pastor or designated Eucharistic Ministry person so that you may be registered by your parish with the dioceses. Deadline for registering is April 4th, so you will have to act quickly to be involved in the Spring training session. If the April 15th date is not convenient, there will also be a training session in Mentor on April 22nd (again with an April registration deadline date of April 4th. The candidate, after the diocesan session, is also trained in the parish on local pastoral distribution standard. The candidate will be commissioned by the pastor so that extraordinary ministry of Communion can begin.

A long time E.M. has said: I truly enjoy personally keeping in touch with Jesus Christ, and bring His divine Presence into the lives of my Fellow Parishioners.

Eucharistic Ministry in Church leads to bringing Christ to those parishioners who are ill, recovering from a hospital stay, shut-in or otherwise unable to attend parish liturgies each Sunday. In many cases, you are the only contact the parish has with its shut-ins or apartment bound. And Finally, the ministry can lead to distribution of Holy Communion at Hospitals and nursing homes. So if you're interested in this most valuable ministry, tap your pastor on his shoulder, tell him you are a Knight of Columbus, and want to help out in the Parish, and can be registered for the diocesan E.M. training session. BEFORE APRIL 4th.

Community Volunteerism—Meals on Wheels

The following notes on the North Olmsted Meals on Wheels operation are similar to the other communities.

- Service eligibility is limited to the residents of North Olmsted only, over the age of 55, who are: living alone, homebound unable to transport self to a grocery store and unable to prepare own food.
- Volunteering takes approximately an hour and one-half, one day a week.
- Drivers are given a route with detailed map
- Volunteers arrive at the Senior Center at approx. 10:30 a.m. to pickup their routes and meals.
- Drivers deliver one hot and one cold meal on each visit.

Wouldn't it be great if we can grow a nucleus of 45 Knights or more from the 70 or so Knights living in North Olmsted? If you are available and interested in volunteering at North Olmsted Monday's or Wednesday's, Please contact coordinator Tiffany Hunt direct at 440-719-4264 for scheduling or for more information, mention that you are a North Olmsted Knight.

Additionally, volunteer bakers are wanted every Tuesday morning to prepare and bake fresh-baked desserts.
