and the Director of all Saint Augustine Church ministries for 35 years. Sister Corita Ambro, CSJ Director of the Hunger Center and advocate for the deaf and poor for 35 years. She has an untiring dedication to all our ministries.

Saint Augustine Church is a poor inner-city parish of Cleveland, Ohio. Saint Augustine Church constantly look for ways to raise funds for all their ministries. Private donations and projects throughout the years, have been Saint Augustine's only source of revenue. If you are one who shares our love and care for the homeless, the poor, the blind, and the disabled, then perhaps you may want to support a ministry that is close to your heart. You can choose one or all of the Saint Augustine ministries. Saint Augustine Church will be forever indebted to you and we will never forget you.

Saint Augustine also has many ways that they serve the blind. The Saint Augustine Church has a blind board made up of their own blind parishioners. They can tell them what they need and they plan trips for the entire blind community. The deaf friends are always included.

St. Augustine Hunger Center is an outgrowth of the ministry and service of St. Augustine Church. This parish has a long history of service from it's beginning in 1860 when it welcomed an impoverished immigrant community. It provided food for the poor during the depression and hard economic times. The Hunger Center was founded as part of that outreach 35 years ago. The Hunger Center not only provides meals but addresses other needs of the poor and the homeless such as, food, clothing, emergency funding for rent and utilities, furniture, appliances as well as a vocation for those poor seeking medical help. The Hunger center is a response to the human need. Saint Augustine's prayer is that with support and help of the larger community they will be able to serve needy people in accordance with our mission and as completely as possible.

The Saint Augustine deaf community helps in so many ways. They have what is called our deaf choir. They sign for many events at St. Augustine. Many of them are hearing. On special days they will entertain us by signing the words to the music. They have a director who signs to the choir so that the deaf can participate with us in many of our programs.

Each July **Saint Augustine Rainbow Camp** is setup with many diversified activities for Saint Augustine's children who are disabled.

After the attack Sgt. Haworth spent nearly six months in Walter Reed Medical Center where he had to learn how to walk and write again. With the support of his wife Mallorie and their six-month old daughter Emma Sgt. Haworth underwent a rigorous physical therapy schedule and was ultimately released from Walter Reed in August 2012. With the help of a VA Loan Sgt. Haworth and his family purchased their first home: a newly remodeled ranch in Olmsted Township, Ohio. Despite passing an inspection when the family attempted to move into the home on November 8, 2012, they found that the entire house was infested with black mold.

<sup>□</sup> Unable to move into the house the couple moved into the basement of Mallorie's parent's home while they continued to pay an \$1,100/month mortgage for an unlivable home. Thankfully, this soldier's worthy cause was taken up by the local Military support organization NEOPAT, a non-profit organization created to honor patriots who serve, or have served, in the armed forces by working to minimize the sacrifices the soldiers and their families endure.



In the spring of 2013, the national nonprofit

organization Housing Our Nation's Outstanding Returning Soldiers (H.O.N.O.R.S.) heard Sgt. Haworth's story and contacted the family to learn more about their situation. The mission of H.O.N.O.R.S. is to construct new homes or remodel and adapt existing homes to accommodate the special needs arising from injuries sustained by veterans in combat at low or no cost to the veterans themselves. In 2013 H.O.N.O.R.S. committed to aiding the Haworth family and NEOPAT by leading demolition and rebuilding efforts for Haworth home. H.O.N.O.R.S. will also provide volunteer labor for the home rebuilding project.
